Tending the Flock

Reasons for the Seasons

"While the earth remains, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night, shall not cease." – Genesis 8:22

Even so, come, Lord Jesus!

Each December 31, people all over the world gather with friends to "ring in" a new year. But have you ever considered why we mark time the way that we do? Why do we organize our lives around units of twenty-four hours, twelve months, and four seasons?

An astronomer might answer that it simply reflects the mechanics of Earth moving through the solar system. But a deeper question remains: Why did God structure our world this way? I believe scripture provides several reasons.

Evidence of our Creator

God uses creation to reveal important aspects of His nature to all mankind. As David wrote in Psalm 19:1, *"The heavens declare the glory of God, and the sky above proclaims his handiwork."* Paul later declared that the created world testifies to God's *"invisible attributes, namely, his eternal power and divine nature"* (Rom. 1:20).

Earth's cycle of seasons provides clear evidence of an intelligent Creator, such as how the seasons support our need to grow food. Each year includes just enough time to plant, nurture, and harvest crops to provide a reliable food supply. Even the animals, who neither sow nor reap (Matt. 6:26), are sustained by plants growing in their proper seasons.

Reminder to Worship God

Samuel Johnson famously wrote that "men more frequently require to be reminded than informed." (*The Rambler*, No. 2) This principle was already clear during the Old Testament era, as God ordained specific rituals for the same time each year. The Mosaic law prescribed a precise schedule for observances such Passover, Firstfruits, and the Day of Atonement. (Lev. 23)

These holidays reminded the Israelites of God's character and of actions He had taken in their history. Similarly, the church holds annual celebrations such as Christmas, Easter, and Pentecost. We are an easily distracted people, so these are critical in promoting consistent worship of our Lord.

Encouragement for the Future

After the Flood God promised Noah that He would not again interrupt the cycle of days and

3 SOHLS Questions

1. What is SOHLS? It is the acronym used by life-affirming individuals and organizations in reference to Sanctity Of Human Life Sunday. SOHL is the understanding that human life is inviolable because we are made in the image of God. (Gen 1:26-27) SOHLS is the Sunday on which life-affirming churches recognize and celebrate that unique relationship to God, and that all human life, particularly preborn life, is worthy of honor and protection.

2. When is SOHLS 2024? It will be observed this year on January 21. (But as Peggie Recker has said, "EVERY Sunday, every DAY is Sanctity of Human

Life Day! Spot on, Peggie!) Each year since 2011, the service at Boulevard on SOHLS has included a message from Care Net, Puget Sound's largest faith-based, life-affirming pregnancy resource center.

3. Why is this SOHLS article on Page 2, which is the page to inform us about our global workers? Anyone who actively supports or works with Care Net IS a global worker — without leaving home! That's because our m** field walks right into our facilities! Many women experiencing unplanned or unsupported pregnancies do not know (or have

What's New for You in 2024?

If you are like most people, each new year begins with a list of goals, dreams, and desires that you hope to realize within the next twelve months. Sadly, statistics reveal that only about 9% of those who make resolutions keep them, and 43% quit by the end of January. In a way, the apostle Paul made daily resolutions, and sometimes. he felt as unsuccessful as we do. Remember these words in Romans 7:15? "For what I am working out, I do not understand; for I am not practicing what I would like to do, but I am doing the very thing I hate." When Paul wrote his letter to the Romans, he felt he failed to accomplish his resolution to live for Christ. His despair led him to exclaim in verse 24, "Wretched man that I am! Who will deliver me from the body of this death?"

Thankfully, in the years between A.D. 56, when he wrote Romans, and A.D. 60, when he wrote to the Philippians, Paul grew in Christian maturity. The Lord taught him how to think appropriately as a born-again Christian. So, in Philippians 3:12-14, the apostle Paul penned these words, "Not that *I have already obtained it or have already* become perfect, but I press on so that I may lay hold of that for which also I have been laid hold of by Christ Jesus. Brothers, I do not consider myself as having laid hold of it yet, but one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and reaching forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus." In this passage, Paul provides us with three essential realities for growing in the new year:

1. Admit our weaknesses, but don't dwell on them.

Let's face it, we all have flaws. As long as we live in our unredeemed bodies, we will be ladened with the frailties of the flesh. There are times when we give in to the lusts of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, or the pride of life. In short, we still sin! Ignoring or denying our weaknesses does not serve us well, but we are equally handicapped if we dwell too much on our weaknesses. You will never progress if your back is turned away from the goal. Yes, we may miss a hurdle, but dwelling on it will not help us get over the next one. Paul was determined to press on so that he would *lay hold of* that for which Christ Jesus had laid hold of him.

2. Let go of the past and reach forward.

At first glance, this may appear to be the same thing, but let's consider what Paul is saying more closely. It is one thing to not dwell on the past, but *reaching forward* to what lies ahead is entirely different. The phrase reaching forward translates a single Greek word. It means "to exert effort or energy toward the utmost; conceived of as extending or stretching out to the full length." The picture is that of a sprinter who fully lays out forward, straining with everything he has to cross the finish line before his opponents. In our Christian life, we can only reach forward by letting go of the past. The writer of Hebrews tells us to fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and finisher of faith (Heb. 12:2).

3. Fix your eyes on the goal to which you are called.

The goal to which we are called is to be conformed to the character of Christ (Rom. 8:29). In the letter to the Ephesians, Paul taught that Christ gave to the church, "some as apostles, and some as prophets, and some as evangelists, and some as pastors and teachers, for the equipping of the saints for the work of service, to the building up of the body of Christ, until we all attain to the unity of the faith, and of the full knowledge of the Son of God, to a mature man, to the measure of the stature which belongs to the fullness of Christ" (Eph. 4:11-13). In other words, believers' goal of growth and development is to be like Christ. When Christlikeness is the focus of our straining ahead, we find little energy to explore the flesh's sinful desires.

So, what is new for you in 2024? I encourage you to set your goal to be like Jesus firmly at the forefront of every plan. May your most extraordinary effort be to glorify God by becoming like Jesus. If that is your goal and the focus of your efforts, you will glorify God and be most satisfied in Him, and 2024 will be your best year yet, no matter what happens in the world around you.



seasons as He had just done. But the promise came with one condition. Summer and winter, day and night, would not cease "while the earth remains." (Gen. 8:22) And God later confirmed that our present planet will not endure forever.

Peter wrote that "the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a roar..." (II Peter 3:10). And John saw in his vision "a great white throne and him who was seated on it. From his presence earth and sky fled away, and no place was found for them" (Rev. 20:11).

For those in Christ this prophecy is no cause for despair. Quite the opposite! God will replace our Earth with something far better: *"A new heaven, and a new earth,"*

where "the dwelling place of God is with man" (Rev. 21:1-3). This will certainly involve dramatic changes. There will be no night, for example. (Rev. 21:25) But I find it encouraging that God will also retain some familiar elements.

Consider the Tree of Life, which will produce "twelve kinds of fruit, yielding its fruit each month" (Rev. 22:2). It appears that even in eternity we will be aware of years and seasons, but now completely freed from the effects of Adam's sin. (Gen. 3:17) There will be no harsh winters, no failed crops, and a lifegiving harvest every month! So as a new year begins, let us worship the Lord of all creation and share with everyone Christ's invitation to dwell with Him forever. (John 14:3)


