






Be Thou My Vision

SERMON NOTES | Mark 6:30-56 (p. 841)

From the Jaws of the Liar Electronic Outline

1. Jesus the Provider & Parts Played

Questions for Home or Discipleship Community:

- 1. The lies of Satan sow suspicion of God into our hearts. Often with ideas of, "is God punishing me for something?" What thoughts or doubts manifest suspicion of God in your life?
- 2. Jesus offers himself as the compassionate shepherd to his sheep. Shepherds feed, protect, know, and lead the sheep. Which one do you need most in your life right now?
- 3. Jesus conquers the dragon with compassion. How does Christ's compassion fuel your sacrificial service of him? Where do you need to apply his compassion to you right now? What relational opportunities are there for you to show compassion as an ambassador for Christ?

CORE VALUES

CRUCIFORMITY

When no single word will do, you coin a new one. By Cruciformity, we mean two things. First, our corporate life is all about Christ and him crucified. It is popular to call this "gospel-centered ministry". Cruciformity adds something important. Michael Gorman defined Cruciformity like this—"a dynamic correspondence in daily life to the strange story of Christ crucified as the primary way of experiencing the love and grace of God." We see the Christian life as a daily experience of God's love and grace as we experience many crosses, especially our own weakness (Phil 2:1-11, Rom 5:1-11).

EVANGELISM & HOSPITALITY

Michael Green's book on Evangelism in the Early Church estimates that 80% of the evangelism of the early church happened in the personal lives of members, not pastors. This implies that the gospel is not only something we believe, but also a story playing out in our lives. As this story unfolds, others see it and we invite them to adopt the gospel-story for themselves. (1 Thess 2:1-9)

VERACITY

The word veracity means "conformity to the truth." In a world of alternative facts, we are all hungry for honesty, transparency, and authenticity. Breakwater is committed to all three. We value clear and straight-forward preaching from the Bible (2 Cor 4:1-6), otherwise known as expositional preaching. We also summarize our beliefs for all to see. Just as important, we are committed to living in conformity with the truth authentic about weakness and the strength we find in the gospel (1 Timothy 1:12-17, 2 Timothy 1:13, 1 John 1:6-10).

KINGDOM GENEROSITY

Jesus taught directly about giving. Most helpfully, he said, "It is more blessed ("luckier") to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35). We recognize that giving is to our benefit because it reminds us that we are recipients of full and free grace (Matt 13:44-46) that is more precious than our earthly possessions. We strive to embody generosity in supporting other local churches, meeting felt needs, and supporting home & foreign missionaries (2 Cor 9:1-15).

MUTUALITY & ACCOUNTABILITY

An ancient Christian creed says that the church is a manifestation of God's grace to us. Simply put, other Christians become instruments in Christ's hands to accomplish his purpose (Romans 12:4-5). This means several things for Breakwater. We are all in it together—not just church, but all of life. We "one-another" one another. We pray for one another. We encourage one another. We bear one another's burdens. In addition, Christ gave church officers and other churches for us too! We do this with churches in our own tradition, but with other churches as well.

HETEROGENEITY (Unity & Diversity)

This long word perfectly illustrates an important gospeltruth. It is built from two Greek words: *heteros* and *geneō*. Together they mean—born from diversity. The Bible describes churches as places of notable diversity and extraordinary unity. "Here there is not Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave, or free; but Christ is all, and in all" (Col 3:11). The gospel provides a unity

that transcends all categories. We will strive to represent that reality by stubbornly refusing to be divided (Ephesians 2, Gal 3:27-29).

OUR CITY

Proximity implies responsibility. In his famous parable about the Good Samaritan, Jesus is answering the question, "who is my neighbor, whom I am to love as myself?" This parable offers a direct and challenging answer. "Your neighbor is whoever God places in your path!" Proximity implies responsibility. We are committed to the physical and spiritual good of the city of Sheboygan (Luke 10:25-37).
