

(1) Review for a few minutes the four incontrovertible and undisputed facts that are agreed upon by virtually all historians, psychologists, philosophers and theologians, whether they are Christians or atheists.

(3) What would you say to someone who argues in favor of the theory that Jesus never died at all on the cross? What are the factors that make this a ridiculous argument?

(4) What would you say to someone who argues that the followers of Jesus experienced a mass hallucination that he was alive? Would it not be as great a miracle to believe such a phenomenon as to believe that God actually raised Jesus from the dead?

(5) What is your opinion about those who say that what came out of the tomb wasn't the literal body of Jesus but the once-dead faith of the apostles?

(6) Finally, why do you think unbelievers reject the bodily resurrection of Jesus? Is it truly because they lack historical evidence? Is it because there isn't sufficient evidence? Or is it because they can't afford to believe in the resurrection for what it would cost them in terms of how they live? Discuss this at length.
