Religious Terminology

Apologetics — A branch of theology that is devoted to providing a defense of the gospel against objections and false claims.

Black Consciousness — A common view held among the individuals in the Conscious Community that states humans are socially conditioned or coerced by the global system of white supremacy to maintain a dull state of mind rather than liberate their minds and themselves from their oppressive realities.

Black Liberation Theology — Teaches that the Christian gospel carries a message of freedom, and that Jesus is the Liberator, fighting on the side of the oppressed throughout the world and particularly in the United States.

Coptic — A Christian group indigenous to Egypt in north Africa.

Hebrew Israelites — A Black Religious Identity Cult (BRIC) that believes black and brown people are the chosen people of God and that the curse of Ham explains the suffering of black people in the world.

Imago Dei — A Latin expression that all humans are created in the image of God.

Kemetism — Is a modern *polytheistic* practice of a religious tradition of Ancient Egypt. It recognizes many gods and goddesses.

Orthopraxy — refers to how a Christian acts or performs, rather than what they believe.

Race — A social construct that characterizes people based on their physical traits (i.e., skin color, hair, etc.)
