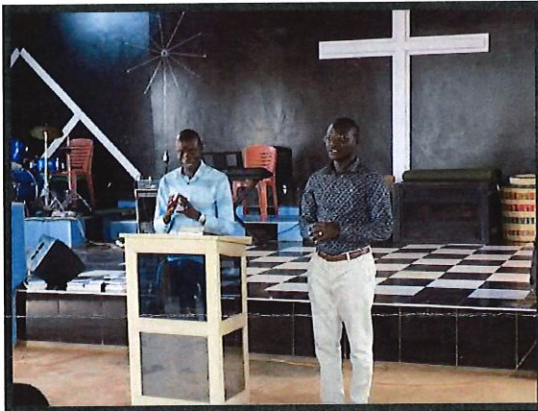
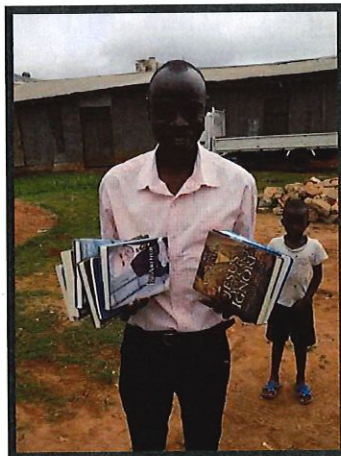

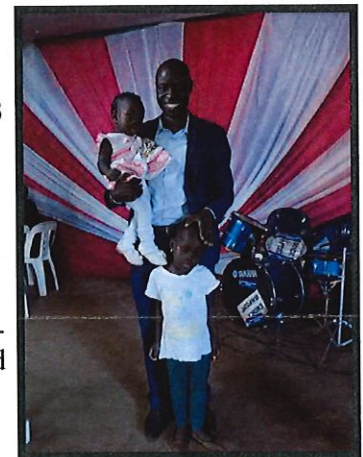

Before our departure from Uganda in 2020, he became the leader of the Kampala area Baptist pastors and was active in the Uganda Baptist Association; he had many working friendships throughout the country in that capacity. Alex introduced me to many Ugandan Baptist regional leaders and the Lord continued to bless our times of teaching together, hosted by the Baptist leaders. I was blessed to help Alex and Beatrice with pre-marriage counseling. I was glad that he agreed to continue to serve with us when we rebased in the USA and he has done a wonderful job in leading the work in Uganda since then. leadership training and as result we have been able to plant many churches around Uganda. Beatrice is so much involved in women ministry and more especially reaching out to prostitutes with the gospel, she also participates in providing skills to ex-prostitutes through providing training on hair dressing. KAPPY'S CORNER—A Mighty Rushing Wind

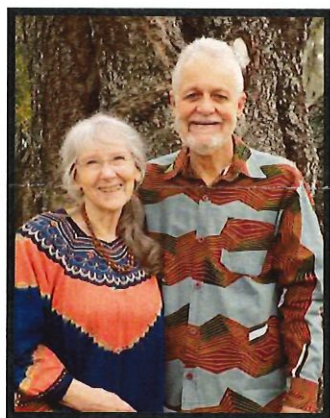
It all began over thirty years ago. The church Jim and I were a part of began undergoing what could be called an awakening of sorts. As we learned more about historic revivals we, along with the church, began praying that the Holy Spirit would do a mighty work in the body of Christ. At that time I was about five years old in the faith and joyful in the salvation Christ had given me. Step by step, I was learning more about the love of God, and I was serving Him in the church. For me, that was enough. I was praying for revival—yes—but without really knowing what I was praying for.

Recently, Jim and I have each read accounts of historic awakenings, or revivals. I read John Weir's book, *THE ULSTER AWAKENING*, an Account of the 1859 Revival in Ireland (originally published in 1860). Jim read D.M. Phillips' book, *EVAN ROBERTS, The Great Welsh Revivalist and His Work*—about the Welsh revival of 1904. Both books contain multiple, candid, eyewitness accounts of the earthshaking outpouring of the Holy Spirit that occurred at those two times in history.

Lately, Jim has been preaching here, there, and on the radio about true revival. He has referred to the book of Acts 2:2, describing a movement of the Holy Spirit that began suddenly with a sound that came from heaven as of a mighty rushing wind. It filled the place where believers were gathered in prayer. True revivals are movements of the Holy Spirit, not always manifested in the same way, but always by God's grace, not by human effort. And yet, we've read that revivals come when God's people pray believingly, penitently, and perseveringly ... "until 'the sound of abundance of rain' shall be heard from heaven."

All these years later, we're still praying and longing for revival, for ourselves, for our country, and worldwide. Holy Spirit, come—revive our hearts!
