What do I learn about God?

God doesn't take it lightly when people try to destroy His local churches. Even with all of their flaws, the Corinthian church was His dwelling place.

Is there anything for which I should repent based on this text?

Is there any way that I am doing something destructive in the church? Is there any way that I am boasting in who I'm connected to, rather than recognizing all of God's leaders as merely servants?

How might God use this passage to make me look more like Christ?

How does this passage affect evangelism?

How can I edify the church based on what this passage says?

To be humble and grateful for the grace of God that He's given to our church is what will bring about spiritual health for God's glory. Instead of complaining, I can look for ways to humbly encourage people in whom I see God working.
