THE UNRIGHTEOUSLY RIGHTEOUS Romans 2

MONDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 16:1-15

"One who heard us was a woman named Lydia, from the city of Thyatira, a seller of purple goods, who was a worshiper of God. The Lord opened her heart to pay attention to what was said by Paul" (Acts 16:14). This verse reminds us that it is not the preacher of the gospel that opens the listener's hearts; it is the Lord. It does not matter how persuasive or wise we are; it is God's supernatural work that draws people to Christ. The Christian is responsible for sharing the good news, not the changing of hearts.

TUESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 16:16-24

Paul and Silas were beaten and imprisoned for the disruption they had caused. More specifically, Paul had caused the owners of a slave girl to lose their profit. Paul did this by commanding the spirit to come out of her in the name of Christ. Since there was no fair hearing, their imprisonment and beatings were a miscarriage of justice. It is not uncommon for disciples of Christ to face injustice from the world. We should come to expect such miscarriages of justice. Praise the Lord when you meet the injustice of this world for the sake of Christ. Pray that it is used for His Glory.

Wednesday

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 16:25-40

"As a result of preaching the Gospel, Paul and Silas were beaten and thrown into prison (Acts 16:16–40). For most of us, such a turn of events would probably create a high level of anxiety, but not for Paul and Silas. Instead we read: "About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God" (v. 25). We don't know anything about the content of their prayers, but the whole tenor of the narrative suggests they were thanking God that they were counted worthy to suffer for Christ's sake and were asking Him to use their circumstances to further the Gospel. They were fully trusting God." - Jerry Bridges

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 17:10-15

FRIDAY

Today's passage is familiar to many, even if they do not know the reference. This passage is what is referenced when someone says that we need to be good Bereans. These Berean Jews examined "the Scriptures daily to see if these things were so" (v. 11). The activity of daily searching Scripture is commended in this passage. We are being encouraged to be in the Bible and to seek greater understanding. Pray for a renewed spirit to daily seek out a greater understanding of Scripture.

THURSDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 17:1-9

Keith Mathison writes: "In Paul's preaching, for example, he explained from the Old Testament that it was necessary for the Messiah to suffer and that Jesus was the Messiah (Acts 17:2–3). But where would Paul have gone in the Old Testament to prove that it was necessary for the Messiah to suffer? There are a number of texts to which he could have turned (for example, Ps. 16; 22), but one of the most significant was likely Isaiah 52:13–53:12." Take time to read over these passages in Psalms and Isaiah. Pray over these passages and ask the Lord for a greater understanding of Christ and the need for Him to come and suffer.

SATURDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 17:16-21

Paul's spirit, not the Holy Spirit, was provoked within him. Paul's spirit was provoked and troubled that the city was devoted to idols. Paul saw a people that were devoted to false gods, and it troubled him. Paul desired to reason with them (v. 17), which is to witness for Christ. Pray that you would follow Paul's example and seek to witness for Christ when your heart is troubled for others.
