Suggested Sermon Discussion Questions

2 Peter 3:8-13

“The Wait is Not a Waste”

How does Peter’s perspective on time challenge our tendency to think God is slow, absent, or forgetful?

Peter says everything in this world will be “burned up.” How should that truth affect the way we think about possessions, careers, comfort, and success?

Peter asks, “What sort of people ought you to be?” (v.11). Why do you think Peter connects the certainty of Christ’s return with holy living?

Peter teaches that God’s delay is an expression of mercy. How should that shape our attitudes toward unbelieving friends, family members, and neighbors?

If someone examined your calendar, spending habits, entertainment choices, and conversations, would they conclude that you are living for this world or for the world to come?

Peter describes the new creation as a place “in which righteousness dwells.” What part of that promise gives you the greatest hope right now?

Peter teaches that the wait is not a waste because God is patient, Christ is coming, and a better world awaits His people. What would need to change in your life this week if you truly believed that reality?
