

Suggested Sermon Discussion Questions Isaiah 25:1–26:6, "Reasons for Eternal Praise"

- 1. Read 25:1. What wonderful things has God done to save you in the past?
- 2. Read 25:6. Do you think non-Christians think of God like a host of a wonderful feast? Why? Or Why not?
- 3. Do you think Christians think of God like a host of a wonderful feast? Why? Or Why not?
- 4. Reflect on 25:8. We are told that God will take away our reproach (shame). We are all ashamed of things that we've done, said, or thought in the past. Take time to reflect on the fact that God not only forgives, but He offers an end to being ashamed.
- 5. 25:9 are the words that will be uttered in the future as we are in the presence of our God. What things make it hard for you to wait on God today? Think about your own uttering of these words in the future. When you are in the presence of Christ, how do you imagine that you'll think about all the time you had to wait for Him to return?
- 6. In thinking of Moab's punishment, what was offered to them and what did they reject? Look back to 16:3-6
- 7. Consider the setting of 26:1-3. When will perfect trust and perfect peace be realized?
