### **What do I learn about God?**

Even while rebuking the people who have forsaken Him, He makes offers of salvation, redemption, and restoration. Our God is merciful.

### **Is there anything for which I should repent based on this text?**

### **How might God use this passage to make me look more like Christ?**

This passage calls for a return to righteous living before God. Christ, the Righteous One is my pattern.

### **How does this passage affect evangelism?**

God offers Himself as Savior to those who have forsaken and despise Him. He also will be their judge if they reject Him.

### **How can I edify the church based on what this passage says?**

Sometimes brothers and sisters start to despise God and each other. It is important to be honest with them about their sin and then to point them to our merciful God.
