What do I learn about God?

God gives His people all they need to walk faithfully with Him. He gave Judah and Israel what they needed and He gives His church all that we need (2 Pet 1:3).

Is there anything for which I should repent based on this text?

The list of 6 woes in verses 8-23 should be thought upon.

How might God use this passage to make me look more like Christ?

As Christ bore fruit in His ministry before the Father, so should I be bearing fruit.

How does this passage affect evangelism?

I know people whose lifestyle reflects one or more of the "woes" in this passage. They need to be warned and shown God's salvation.

How can I edify the church based on what this passage says?

Remind people of the ways God has privileged and aided us to walk in His ways. He's given us what we need. This should be an encouragement to us.
