What Is an Apostate?

by R.C. Sproul

“This question of whether a person can lose his salvation is not an abstract question. It touches us at the very core of our Christian lives, not only with regard to our concerns for our own perseverance, but also with regard to our concern for our family and friends, particularly those who seemed, for all outward appearances, to have made a genuine profession of faith. We thought their profession was credible, we embraced them as brothers or sisters, only to find out that they repudiated that faith.

PASSAGE DISCUSSION

2 Peter 2:10b-22

"The Danger of Desertion"

1. Peter describes the false teachers as arrogant, sensual, and greedy. Which of these temptations do you think is most subtle or culturally acceptable today, and why?
2. What are some modern “idols” that Christians can be tempted to trust or pursue instead of Christ (e.g., comfort, success, approval, security, pleasure, control)? Which one do you find most tempting?
3. Read 2 Peter 2:19: “Whatever overcomes a person, to that he is enslaved.” What practical signs reveal that something has become a master in your life rather than a good gift from God?
4. Peter warns that false promises of freedom can actually lead to slavery. What are some messages our culture promotes as “freedom” that ultimately enslave people?
5. According to this passage, why is outward association with Christianity not enough? What evidence does the New Testament give that genuine faith produces lasting transformation and perseverance?
6. What practical habits help keep Christ at the center of our worship instead of allowing lesser things to become ultimate things?

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The 1689 London Baptist Confession

II. Of God and of the Holy Trinity

1. The Lord our God is but ^aone only, living, and true God; whose ^bsubsistence is in and of himself, ^cinfinite in being, and perfection, whose Essence cannot be comprehended by any but himself; ^da most pure spirit, ^einvisible, without body, parts, or passions, who only hath immortality, dwelling in the light, which no man can approach unto, who is ^fimmutable, ^gimmense, ^heternal, incomprehensible, ⁱAlmighty, every way infinite, ^jmost holy, most wise, most free, most absolute, ^kworking all things according to the counsel of his own immutable, and most righteous will, ^lfor his own glory, most loving, gracious, merciful, longsuffering, abundant in goodness and truth, forgiving iniquity, transgression, and sin, ^mthe rewarder of them that diligently seek him, and withal most just, ⁿand terrible in his judgments, ^ohating all sin, and who will by no means clear the ^pguilty.
