Toddlers (2-3 y/o): "The Forgiving Prince (Joseph & his Brothers)"

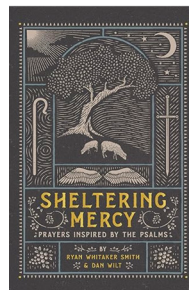

"New Passions are the Path to Holiness"

by John Piper

"God does not come to you this morning and say, 'Okay, holiness is what I want from you. All right? And here's some things that are going to be holy. You don't sleep with her anymore until you're married and you're not going to get drunk on the weekends and you're just going to stop stealing and you're not going to lie anymore. Okay, let's get about it.' That's just totally not Christianity.

He comes to you and spends twelve verses saying, 'Do you see the hope that you have? Do you see the inheritance? Do you see how it's imperishable and undefiled? Do you see how God is keeping you for it? Do you see how he is first putting you through fire in order to make it precious so that you receive glory and praise and art? Do you see that? Do you have knowledge? Now if you do, you've got some new passions and these old ones, these old ones right here, they're not going to govern you anymore and therefore your conduct will be holy.'"

PASSAGE DISCUSSION

2 Peter 1:12-21

"Don't Forget to Remember"

1. Why do you think Peter repeatedly emphasizes the need for “reminders” in verses 12–15? What truths are easiest for Christians to forget?
2. Why is remembering the gospel an ongoing need rather than a one-time event?
3. Peter argues that Christianity is based on historical events, not myths or cleverly invented stories (vv. 16–18). Why is this important?
4. Peter connects the Transfiguration to the future return of Christ. How should the certainty of Christ’s return affect the way believers live today?
5. What practical areas of life should be shaped by the expectation that Jesus is coming again?
6. Where do you find it hardest to live with an eternal perspective?
7. Peter’s argument assumes that what we truly believe about the future will shape how we live in the present. How does your daily life reveal what you are hoping in? What would someone conclude about your greatest hopes by observing your priorities, spending, conversations, and schedule?

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The 1689 London Baptist Confession

I. Of the Holy Scriptures

6. The whole Counsel of God concerning all things ^anecessary for his own Glory, Man's Salvation, Faith and Life, is either expressly set down or necessarily contained in the Holy Scripture; unto which nothing at any time is to be added, whether by new Revelation of the Spirit, or traditions of men.

Nevertheless we acknowledge the ^binward illumination of the Spirit of God, to be necessary for the saving understanding of such things as are revealed in the Word, and that there are some circumstances concerning the worship of God, and government of the Church common to human actions and societies; which are to be ^cordered by the light of nature, and Christian prudence according to the general rules of the Word, which are always to be observed.

7. All things in Scripture are not alike ^aplain in themselves, nor alike clear unto all; yet those things which are necessary to be known, believed, and observed for Salvation, are so ^bclearly propounded, and opened in some place of Scripture or other, that not only the learned, but the unlearned, in a due use of ordinary means, may attain to a sufficient understanding of them.

8. The Old Testament in ^aHebrew (which was the Native language of the people of God of old) and the New Testament in Greek (which at the time of the writing of it was most generally known to the Nations), being immediately inspired by God, and by his singular care and Providence kept pure in all Ages, are therefore ^bauthentic; so as in all controversies of Religion the Church is finally to appeal unto them. ^cBut because these original tongues are not known to all the people of God, who have a right unto, and interest in the Scriptures, and are commanded in the fear of God to read ^dand search them, therefore they are to be translated into the vulgar language of every Nation, unto which they ^ecome, that the Word of God dwelling ^fplentifully in all, they may worship him in an acceptable manner, and through patience and comfort of the Scriptures may have hope.
