We know time with them is precious, and it is a privilege for us to partner with you in their evangelism and discipleship.

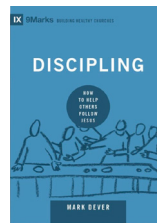
Here are our lessons for today, so you may continue talking about them *as you walk by the way*, and at home this week:

Discipling . . . *How to Help Others Follow Jesus* by Mark Dever

In Matthew 28:19-20, Jesus gives his followers a clear mission to go and make disciples of all nations - this included baptizing them and teaching them to observe all that he commanded.

A disciple of Jesus is one who is maturing in their faith. In this book, author and pastor Mark Dever gives a basic definition of what "discipling" means - it is helping others to follow Jesus, or deliberately doing spiritual good to someone so that he or she will become more like Christ. In the New Testament, discipling is not optional: it is basic.

In the context of the local church, pastors and members alike, are called to make disciples by seeking to serve others sacrificially, inviting / "folding" them into everyday life events, asking the Lord to transform our lives, and continually pointing God's people to biblical truth.

My Times are in Your Hand . . . *Learning to Trust the Speed of God*

by Jon Bloom

"Learning to trust God's timing is not easy, to say the least. This is partly due to our sin and unbelief. But it's also because trusting a frame of reference different from ours is, by definition, counterintuitive. Since we can't calculate God's time, his timing often doesn't make sense to us.

Someone who has created such a thing as light speed, and who knows what's happening in every part of a universe spanning some 93 billion light-years across, is clearly not slow."

PASSAGE DISCUSSION

2 Peter 3:8-13

"The Wait is Not a Waste"

How does Peter's perspective on time challenge our tendency to think God is slow, absent, or forgetful?

Peter says everything in this world will be “burned up.” How should that truth affect the way we think about possessions, careers, comfort, and success?

Peter asks, “What sort of people ought you to be?” (v.11). Why do you think Peter connects the certainty of Christ’s return with holy living?

Peter teaches that God's delay is an expression of mercy. How should that shape our attitudes toward unbelieving friends, family members, and neighbors?

If someone examined your calendar, spending habits, entertainment choices, and conversations, would they conclude that you are living for this world or for the world to come?

Peter describes the new creation as a place “in which righteousness dwells.” What part of that promise gives you the greatest hope right now?

Peter teaches that the wait is not a waste because God is patient, Christ is coming, and a better world awaits His people. What would need to change in your life this week if you truly believed that reality?

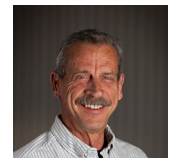

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The 1689 London Baptist Confession

III. Of God's Decree

1. God hath ^aDecreed in himself from all Eternity, by the most wise and holy Counsel of his own will, freely and unchangeably, all things whatsoever comes to pass; yet so as thereby is God neither the author of sin, ^bnor hath fellowship with any therein, nor is violence offered to the will of the Creature, nor yet is the liberty, or contingency of second causes taken away, but rather ^cestablished, in which appears his wisdom in disposing all things, and power, and faithfulness ^din accomplishing his Decree.
