



## *The London Baptist Confession of 1689*

### XIX. Of the Law of God

1. God gave to Adam a Law of universal obedience, <sup>a</sup>written in his Heart, and a particular precept of not eating the Fruit of the tree of knowledge of good and evil; by which he bound him, and all his posterity to personal entire exact and perpetual <sup>b</sup>obedience; promised life upon the fulfilling, and <sup>c</sup>threatened death upon the breach of it; and endued him with power and ability to keep it.

2. The same Law that was first written in the heart of man, <sup>a</sup>continued to be a perfect rule of Righteousness after the fall; and was delivered by God upon Mount Sinai, in <sup>b</sup>Ten Commandments and written in two Tables; the four first containing our duty towards God, and the other six our duty to man.


#### Elders' Comments Regarding Article 19.2

The wording suggests this included the fourth commandment, the command to observe the Sabbath Day.

19:2-5, carried over from the WCF, refers to a 3-fold division (sometimes called Tripartite division) of the law given to Israel (part of the Mosaic, or Sinai Covenant) into ceremonial, judicial (“civic”), and moral law.

Although this theological construct remains helpful to an extent, it is important to keep in mind that Scripture itself does not divide Old Testament law into these categories (also note that some commands do not neatly fit into one category, e.g. Deut. 22:8, and there is a sense in which all law given by God is “moral”). Rather, the law given through Moses was delivered to Israel as one package.

Since Jesus brought fulfillment of what the Mosaic/Sinai Covenant anticipated, Christians in the New Covenant are no longer under the Old Covenant as a covenant (see 2nd Cor. 1:20, and the N.T. book of Hebrews). Christians do, however, remain under the Old Testament as Scripture; it continues to have authority, relevance and value (Rom. 15:4, 2 Tim. 3:16-17). We also note that the New Testament, which speaks of the “Law of Christ” (1 Cor. 9:21; Gal. 6:2), reiterates many Old Testament commands as binding for New Covenant believers (e.g. Rom. 13:8-10; Eph. 6:1-3). As the law of God reveals His righteous character, and how He would have those created in His image to live (His will of precept), it remains woven into the very fabric of creation. Thus we affirm that elements of the Mosaic law, rightly understood in the context of the New Covenant, continue to have application for believers, including as “a Rule of Life” (LBC 19:3; historically referred to as the “Third use of the law”).



"Three Reasons Why Conflict Is Harmful to the Church"  
by Robb Brunansky

"Second, disunity damages gospel witness.

In verse six, Paul told the Corinthians that the testimony of Christ had been confirmed in them through the giving of the Spirit in their midst. Now that they were experiencing disunity, though, conflict was compromising their gospel witness. When believers do not love one another, when we do not walk in unity, when we allow conflict to dominate, when conflict sets the tone for the church and is the air we breathe, then our gospel witness is damaged, making us look just like the world.

On the other hand, church unity confirms that the gospel is true and that we collectively belong to Christ as His disciples because as the church, collectively, we really have nothing worldly that binds us as one. What fashions us together as a church and compels us to love one another is that we are disciples of Jesus, and that we follow and love Christ – and because we love Christ, we love His people even with all their differences. It is this love for one another, amid differences the world prizes so highly but that we disregard entirely, that confirms we have come to know and love Jesus Christ. Our unity in love for Christ and one another is designed by God to be a powerful tool that proclaims gospel witness."
