"In fulfillment of the messianic promise of Psalm 22:18, "when they had crucified him, they divided

his garments among them by casting lots" (Matthew 27:35). This heartbreaking detail is bursting with theological significance. As the covering of nakedness is a sign of God's covenant love (Ezekiel 16:8), the uncovering of nakedness is a symbol of sin's shame and a sign of God's judgement. To faithfulness Israel, God said, "I will gather [your enemies] against you from every side and will uncover your nakedness to them, that they may see all your nakedness" (Ezekiel 16:37).

Jesus died, naked and alone, on the cross so that you and I would know that he died not only to remove the guilt of my sins, but also to remove the shame of my sin, that feeling of uncleanness which robs us of the joy of our salvation and causes us to run and hide from God instead of running to him to 'receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need" (Hebrews 4:16)."
