I will teach biblical truth to my family and acquaintances, as God gives me opportunity, with a desire to see them come to trust Jesus Christ and be saved.


I will always be willing to both give and receive admonition and instruction with meekness and in love.

## SCRIPTURE PASSAGE

## 1 Corinthians 15:20-34

<sup>20</sup>But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead. the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. <sup>21</sup>For as by a man came death, by a man has come also the resurrection of the dead. <sup>22</sup>For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive. <sup>23</sup>But each in his own order: Christ the firstfruits, then at his coming those who belong to Christ. <sup>24</sup>Then comes the end, when he delivers the kingdom to God the Father after destroying every rule and every authority and power. <sup>25</sup>For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. 26 The last enemy to be destroyed is death. <sup>27</sup>For "God has put all things in subjection under his feet." If the dead are not raised, "Let us eat and drink, for tomorrow we die." <sup>33</sup>Do not be deceived: "Bad company ruins good morals."<sup>34</sup>Wake up from your drunken stupor, as is right, and do not go on sinning. For some have no knowledge of God. I say this to your shame.

# Weekly Resource Father, Long Before Creation

by Jesse Johnson "Father, Long Before Creation" is one of my favorite hymns because it is a hymn about one of my favorite doctrines: the covenant of redemption. The song

was written by Chinese Christians who were facing startling persecution in the cultural upheaval of the 1950's. At some point it was translated into English and eventually Andrew Osenga (at the time part of Cademan's Call) wrote joyful music to accompany it.

The hymn's background helps explain why both the song and the doctrine of the covenant of redemption are so comforting. When faced with a world that seems to be falling apart, rather than going forward to heaven, or backwards to the cross, the hymn instead directs the worshiper to a time before nations existed and before people rebelled. In fact, the song draws us back before Genesis 1:1—and not just a day or two before Genesis, but "long before creation."
