Conclude the Lord's Day with His people, tonight at 6:00 PM.

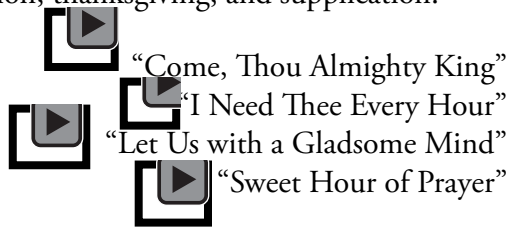
