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Introduction

“Christ Church exists to make mature disciples who will worship, know, and serve our Lord Jesus Christ so that His church and kingdom are powerfully extended in Katy and beyond.”

Christ Church is a congregation of the Presbyterian Church in America located in the heart of Katy, Texas, one of the fastest-growing and most affluent communities in the greater Houston metropolitan area. Founded in 1999 by a small group of six families who gathered to pray about planting a new Reformed congregation on the west side of Houston, the church has grown steadily under the Lord’s faithful provision for over twenty-six years.

Our Community



The Katy area has experienced extraordinary growth over the past two decades, driven by the expansion of the energy industry, top-tier medical research facilities, world-class master-planned communities, and a highly regarded public school system.

Christ Church is located in the south Katy area near the Cinco Ranch master plan area, surrounded by both new and established neighborhoods with many single-family homes where families from white-collar and blue-collar backgrounds have put down roots.

Katy's population has grown by more than 35% since 2020 and by nearly 100% since 2010—from about 256,000 residents in 2010 to roughly 504,000 in 2025. As used in this brochure, the “Katy area” means the area located within a 20-minute radius of Christ Church.

The Katy area is home to a diverse population, with over 20% being foreign-born. There are many families with school-aged children, and a concentration of professionals in the energy, healthcare, engineering, legal, & financial sectors, as well as those working in blue-collar jobs.

With a median household income of approximately \$115,000—more than 40% above the Houston metropolitan average—and nearly half of adult residents holding a bachelor's degree or higher, the Katy community reflects a culture of ambition and self-reliance.

While all these statistics are admirable in many respects, Katy represents a community with significant potential for gospel impact:

- With a high concentration of families, there is a significant need for meaningful youth and family ministry and thoughtful community engagement.
- With a culture that values work, self-reliance, and recreation, there is need for gospel ministry that drives people to see and savor Christ alone.
- And where God has brought the world to Katy, giving us mission and ministry opportunities.

2001



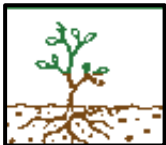
CCK is particularized in the Houston Metro Presbytery. John Carroll is CCK's first Associate Pastor.

Our Theology & Ministry Profile

We believe it is the call and duty of the elders of God's church, as Christ's under-shepherds, to instruct, encourage, and equip His saints to bear fruit for the glory of God. We are committed to the following principles to guide our mission and message in ministry.

A. Biblical Fidelity and

Confessional Integrity - An

unyielding commitment to the inspiration, inerrancy, authority, sufficiency, and efficacy of Scripture for faith and practice, along with a resolute adherence to the Westminster Standards (Isa.

55:10–11; 2 Tim. 3:16–17;

Titus 1:9; 2 Pet. 1:21; Rom. 10:17; Jude 3; Heb. 10:23).



B. Spirit-Filled, Christ-Centered, and Gospel-Driven Ministry - A sincere passion to proclaim the gospel of grace, always with the aim of exalting Christ in the hearts, minds, and affections of God's people (1 Cor. 1:23, 2:2; Eph. 3:8; John 21:15–19; Phil. 1:21, 3:8).

C. Earnest Prayer and Expository Preaching - A resolve to practice fervent prayer both privately and from the pulpit, along with an unbending dedication to expository preaching, which through the Holy Spirit informs the mind, transforms the heart, and stirs the affections (Matt. 6:5–13; 1 Thess. 5:17; Eph. 1:15–23; Acts 2:14–36, 2:42, 12:5, 20:27; Rom. 10:14–15; 2 Tim. 4:1–5).



- D. Intentional Evangelism and Personal Discipleship** - A purposeful commitment to bold evangelism, coupled with a dedication to the old paths of serious, deliberate, faith-maturing discipleship (Acts 7:1–60, 8:26–40; Matt. 28:19; Luke 9:1–6, 9:23–24; Col. 1:28–29).
- E. Godly Leadership and Presbyterian Polity** - A sincere devotion to personal piety among church leadership, as well as a strong adherence to biblical Presbyterianism, including consistent involvement in the courts of the church and service to the PCA (1 Pet. 5:1–4; Acts 15:1–21, 20:28; 1 Tim. 3:1–7, 4:12; Titus 1:5–9).
- F. Reformed Worship and Vibrant Community** - A joyful commitment to and humble confidence in the ordinary means of grace in Lord's Day worship (which begins and ends the Lord's Day), joined together with the nurture of loving Christian fellowship (Exod. 20:1–11; Ps. 100; Acts 2:42–47, 20:7; Rom. 12:10; 1 Cor. 11:17–34, 12:12–31; John 13:34; WCF XXI; WLC Q. 153–196).
- G. Missional Clarity and Outreach** - A fervent and undistracted commitment to make disciples of all nations through the preaching of the gospel and the planting and strengthening of biblical churches, in both Katy and beyond (Matt. 28:16–20; Acts 14:7, 21–23, 15:35; Rom. 10:14–17; Titus 1:5–9).





Our Worship, Ministry, & Fellowship

The practical outworking of our theological commitments is expressed in the vibrant worship, ministry, and fellowship life of Christ Church in:



Regulative Principle of Worship

Our Lord's Day worship follows the Regulative Principle of Worship and is consistently conducted both morning (8:30 AM and 11:00 AM) and evening (6:00 PM). Our style of music in worship may be described as traditional, using selections from the red Trinity Hymnal, the Christ Church Songbook, and the Psalter.

Sacraments

We observe the faithful and regular administration of the Sacraments in corporate worship under the oversight of the session. Those professing faith in Christ as Savior and Lord should be baptized by sprinkling or pouring, as well as their covenant children. Administration of the Lord's Supper, including the sufficient fencing of the table by the minister, occurs not less than monthly.

Complementarian

Christ Church believes that men and women are equal in value before the Lord, yet they each hold different roles in the life of the church. God is gracious to use both men and women to build up His church, but the Bible is clear that only men should hold church offices.

Traditionally Conservative

As the congregation seeks to exalt only Christ in heart, mind, and affection, cultural trends are generally found to be unpersuasive and potentially distracting from the faithful pursuit of the Great Commission. Christ Church is thus temperamentally conservative, slow to embrace cultural influence, and skeptical of social radicalism.



Our Ministry Philosophy

CCK's ministry is rooted in the conviction that God grows His church primarily through the ordinary means of grace: the faithful preaching of His Word, prayer, and the right administration of the sacraments. We believe these means are not "ordinary" because they are unimpressive, but because they are God's ordained (i.e., chosen) instruments for forming mature disciples, equipping them to bear fruit for His kingdom, and sustaining His people here on earth until He calls them Home.

Through our shepherding efforts, we work to be intentional in the lives of those at CCK. Through our programs and ministries, we work to build mature disciples who grow in the grace and knowledge of Christ, as our Lord commands us to do. Each ruling elder is active within their assigned shepherding group, engaging families and individuals in a variety of ways to build relationships and trust. Our pastoral staff is active, conducting a range of care for our congregation beyond just Sunday morning and evening worship (i.e., counseling, hospital visits, lunches/dinners, mentoring, etc.).

To this end, CCK's Session and Pastors hold a yearly retreat with the purpose of looking back over the previous year to review our commitment to the ministries prioritized and pursued at Christ Church. These retreats are a time of prayer and big-picture discussions to discern how best to lead and shepherd our Lord's church here in Katy.

- Catechism for the next generation of children at CCK
- Music, Singing, & fellowship
- Learning & fun activities

Covenant Community Groups

- Hosted in the homes of CCK families to provide intentional Christian fellowship through food, bible study, prayer, and mutual encouragement to build relationships

Woman's & Men's Ministry

- Weekly Bible studies & fellowship for women and men
- Women's ministry to the congregation of CCK: Wedding & Baby showers, Luncheons, Retreats
- Men's ministry to the men of CCK: Prayer breakfast, Book studies, Steak night, Retreats

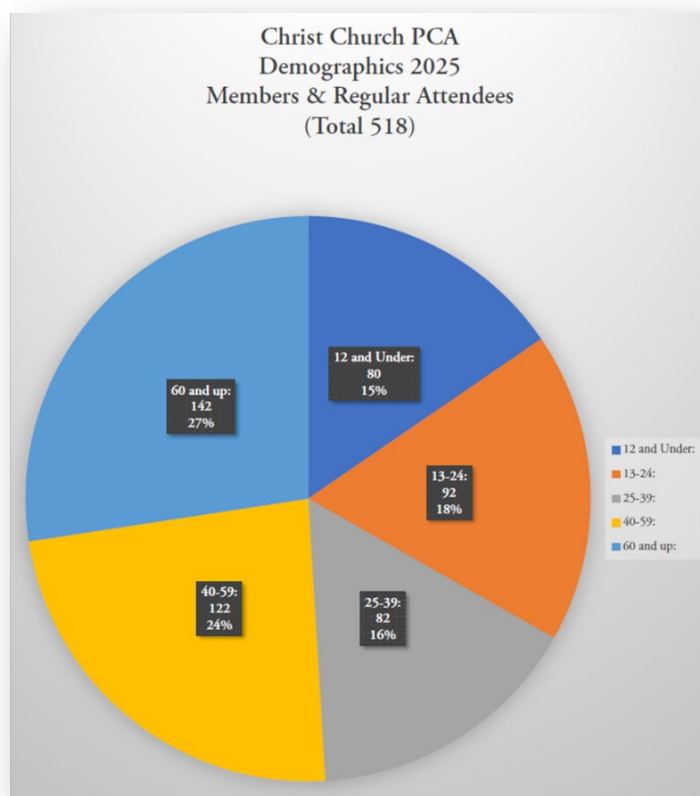
English as a Second Language (ESL)

Currently, we have 11 deacons who meet every other month. The Session and Diaconate occasionally meet jointly for fellowship and prayer.

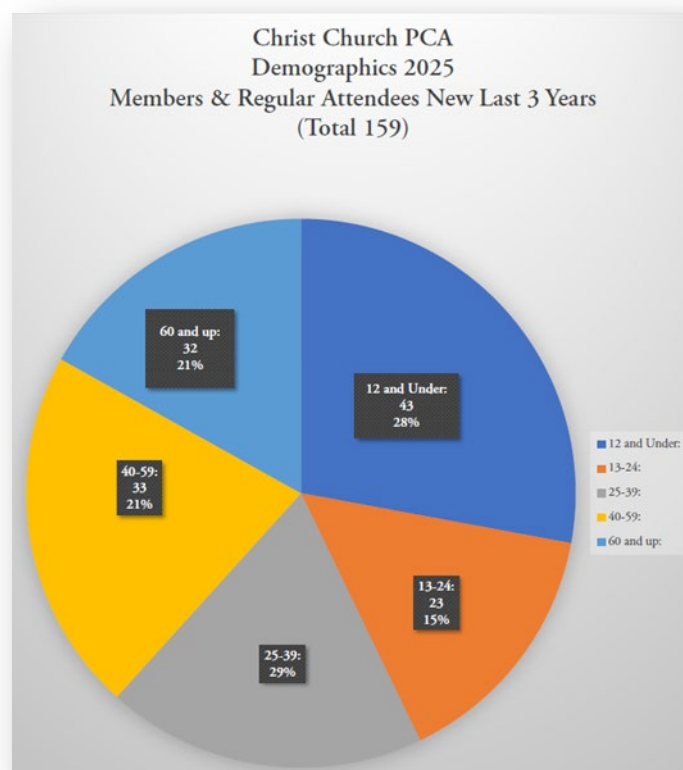
Ministry Coordinators

Session & Diaconate

CCK's Session currently has 6 sitting elders serving and 1 emeritus. There are monthly scheduled session meetings—odd months are for business, even months for shepherding matters and prayer.

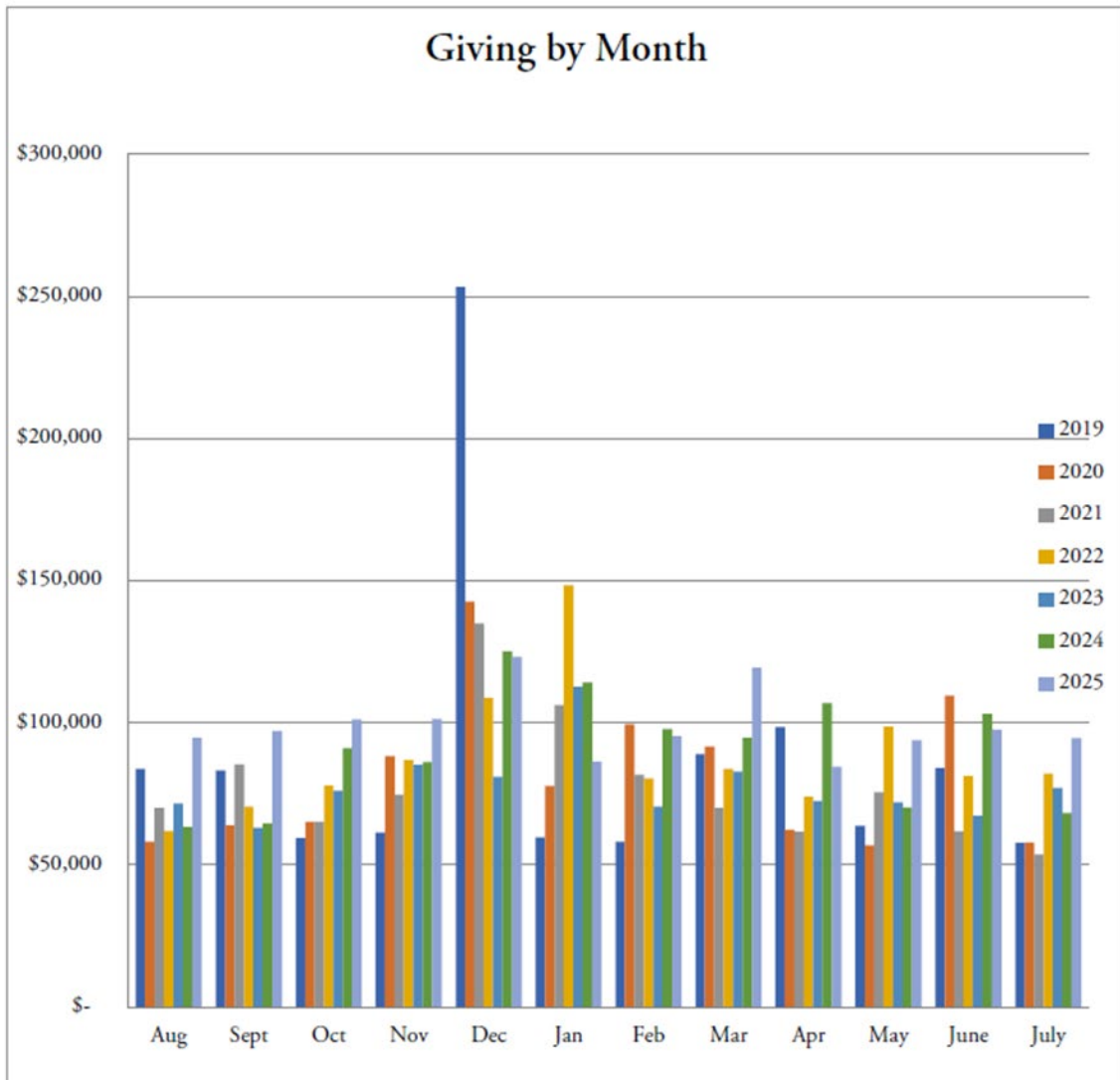
