

Review: Order of Salvation



Review: 1 Thess. 5:23-24

- > God is the Author of sanctification
- > Sanctification brings peace with God
- > It is thorough/whole (all parts)
- > It is complete (God will perform)

Review: Duty of Holiness

NOT REQUIRED

- Nothing required for Atonement
- Nothing required for future justification
- Nothing required for merit

REQUIRED

- Our conscience be aware of God's authority
- Know the reasonableness of the duty
- Love and delight in the duty

Review: Promises of Holiness

Should remind us:

- Of our sense of inability
- To adore the grace of God
- To act in faith

Nature of Sanctification

Generally Sanctification is:

- The work of the Spirit in us
- A real and internal work
- Not a mere persuasion to holiness
- An enablement by God

Differs from Regeneration

- Regeneration is *instantaneous*, not capable of *degrees*
- Sanctification is progressive, capable of degrees



 Increase in sanctification is required –2 Peter 3:17-18

Holiness is like a Seed



Increasing and strengthening graces of holiness already received

Adding occasional graces onto each other

Holiness is like a Seed

INCREASING GRACES

- 1. Working an *immediate* and *actual* increase of graces in us
- Supplying us with experience of truth and reality of beliefs
- 3. Exciting them to *frequent* actings

ADDING GRACES

- 1. Providence is an aid
- 2. Reminds us of our duty
- 3. Sets needful graces to work

Frequent actings

Objectively, by proposing objects suitable to us

- Ordinances of worship
- Chiefly preaching

Subjectively, internally

 Graces are called "fruits of the Spirit" in their exercise



Adding Graces

Providence an aid we <u>must</u> lay hold of He reminds us of our duty
He sets graces to work

Progressive Sanctification

Sanctification is Progressive

"Sanctification is the immediate work of the Spirit of God on the souls of believers, purifying and cleansing of their natures from the pollution and uncleanness of sin, renewing in them the image of God, and thereby enabling them, from a spiritual and habitual principle of grace, to yield obedience unto God, according unto the tenor and terms of the new covenant, by virtue of the life and death of Jesus Christ. It is the universal renovation of our natures by the Holy Spirit into the image of God through Jesus Christ." (Owen III.386)

Sanctification is Progressive

The Work

- Nature = immediate
- Cause = of the Spirit of God
- Object = souls of believers

Context

- The new covenant
- Life and death of Christ
- Fruit: obedience unto God according to the terms of the new covenant (cf. 1 Cor. 5:17)

Sanctification is Progressive


Negative (Put off)

- Action = purifying/cleansing
- Object = their natures
- Symptoms = pollutions/uncleanness
- \circ Root = sin

Positive (Put on)

- Action = renewing/enabling
- Object = the image of God/obedience
- Symptoms = spiritual and habitual principle
- Root = grace

Practical Action: Mortification of Sin

It Begins with FAITH!

Without faith, it is impossible to please God (Hebrews 11:6)

Christ affirms a man is sanctified by faith in him (Acts 26:18)

Faith is the instrumental cause of our sanctification. No faith = no sanctification

Killing Sin: described in two ways

Mortify (put to death)

Put to death therefore what is earthly in you: sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. (Colossians 3:5)

Crucify

And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. (Galatians 5:24)





Object of Mortification

- Root and principle of sin
- Inclination and operation of sin
- Effects or fruits of sin

We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. (Romans 6:6)

Galatians 5:16-24 The War

Constant taking part • Sin's power must of the grace of the Spirit

Constant fighting against the flesh

- be destroyed
- The contest is violent
- The end aimed at is destruction of sin

Mortification is:

- > Painful (Matt. 5:29-30)
- Found in the blood of Christ (Rom. 8:1)
- The work of the Spirit (Rom. 8:11-13)
