The family will receive friends at the Drayton Christian Reformed Church 88 Main Street East, Drayton today February 12, 2017 from 2 to 5 p.m. The funeral service will be held tomorrow in the Drayton Christian Reformed Church at 11 a.m. May God comfort all who mourn.

As you may know we've been praying for the **persecuted Sudanese Christians** living in the Muslim district of Khartoum. A number of Christian pastors have been imprisoned and many church buildings have been destroyed. **Aioub G** (6) reported that one pastor has been released, one sentenced to 12 years in prison and two sentenced to 24 years in prison - no explanation given. Further, Aioub reported that another 27 church buildings have been ordered to be destroyed. It is all very disappointing news. Please continue to pray for our Sudanese brothers and sisters.

On a personal note, Aioub's father lives near the war zone and has broken his hip. Now Aioub is working to get his father to South Sudan and from there to Egypt to get medical attention. In order to do this Aioub is hoping to fly to Egypt to help his father. Please pray that this may be possible and that Aioub will, indeed, be able to help his father.
