Evangelism Outline- 5 questions to ask yourself:

- 1. Who are you seeking? —>Matthew 28:18-20
 - a. Pray over and write at least one name down
 - b. Are you seeking others and sharing what Jesus has done for you?
- 2. Are you praying for the lost? Are you regularly bringing the name or names you have written down to the throne of our Father?
 - a. Praying is a reminder of WHO saves and petitioning God on behalf of another and asking for wisdom in sharing the gospel. Example of Moses in -> Exodus 4:10-12
 - b. Encouragement to write down prayers and petitions, especially specific requests regarding sharing truth with others.
 - c. Be faithful to pray as you seek the Lords help with sharing the gospel, even in times of rejection
- 3. How are you spending your time?
 - a. If sharing the gospel is not something we are actively seeking out, it will be easy to fill up our time with so many other life activities.
 - b. Do you regularly seek the Lord on how you should use your time?
- 4. How are you including others in your life?
 - a. Inviting others into your life is like inviting them to Jesus.
 - b. Inviting others into your life is also inviting them into your community. —> an incredible way to showcase the Father's love for us.
 - c. Include your family, children, GG members, other believers in your life with your disciple making efforts. We need the accountability and encouragement from our community to continue to seek and pray for these relationships.
 - d. Including other believers also allows them to join you in planting seeds of the gospel and are able to show them more fully the love that Jesus has for them.
 - e. Let us continue "to spur one another towards love and good deeds." Hebrews 10:24
- 5. What are some ways you can create interest in the your faith and the gospel?
 - a. Reference to Bob McNabb book "Spiritual Multiplicaton" who used this term "creating interest.
 - i. Speaking of how great God is and of His works!—>Psalm 40:5
 - b. Ways to create interest in the gospel—>
 - i. Find out about your friend, or the one whom you are seeking. What are their real and felt needs?
 - Share your testimony and how Jesus has changed your life. Your life before Jesus , how you felt before you know Him, and why you decided to follow Jesus. Become proficient and practice sharing your story with others.
 - iii. Pray for their needs. Not just say, "I will pray for you", but have the boldness to ask to pray NOW for the need shared with you.
 - iv. Let them see how Christians interact. Love your church and fellow believers —> John 13:35.
 - v. When they are ready to respond to the gospel, invite them to make a decision of faith to follow Jesus.
 - vi. Don't stop once they have trusted in Christ, shepherd and disciple new family member! Book " Now that I am a Christian" great resource.

Final encouraging words from the Bible: Jeremiah 16:19-21 and Revelation 7:9-12

Final quote- As Bob McNabb says in his book, " Don't disqualify yourself in your mind from a work for which Jesus died to qualify you. How greatly God multiplies His children through you depends more on

who He is than on who you are. Let's remember Abraham and how God encouraged him to understand and believe this promise. 'And He brought him outside and said, Look toward heaven, and number the stars, if you are able to number them.' Then he said to him,' So shall your offspring be.' Thankfully Abraham gazed at the stars and believed God for what seemed impossible. Will you?
