LOOKING AHEAD...

Meeting Overview

Council meeting addressed financial status, operational updates, facilities maintenance, and long-term ministry planning.

Administrative and operational topics included building maintenance, cleaning services, communications systems, and financial planning.

Leadership also discussed prayer initiatives and the broader vision for the direction of Chapel Church.

Opening

Ryan Ogurcak called the meeting to order.

Pastor Josh Wargo opened the meeting with prayer.

Prayer asked for wisdom in leadership decisions and faithful stewardship of church resources.

Devotion

Scripture reading: Psalm 31:14–15.

Devotional emphasis on trusting God with both present circumstances and future planning.

Leadership encouraged to remain thankful for the church's current stability while continuing to plan responsibly for the future.

Council reminded that long-term vision must remain grounded in prayer and reliance on God.

Approval of Previous Minutes

Council reviewed the February meeting minutes.

Discussion noted appreciation for the clarity of the minutes and the value of sharing summaries with the congregation.

Motion: Bruce Bailey moved to approve the February minutes.

Second: Arnie Fritzius

Decision: Motion passed unanimously.

Finance Update – February Financial Report (Debi Deller)

Overview of current financial position:

General operating fund balance approximately \$20,000.

Parsonage reserve balance approximately \$14,000.

Building replacement reserve balance approximately \$46,000.

Mortgage Update:

Mortgage payment of \$8,567 made during the month.

Remaining mortgage balance approximately \$109,000.

Council discussed importance of continuing progress toward eliminating mortgage debt.

Daycare Financial Performance:

Daycare program continues operating above projected revenue.

Expenses remain below projected budget levels.

Daycare operations contribute positively to overall church financial stability.

Seasonal Expenses:

Snow removal expenses totaled approximately \$8,625 for the winter season.

Maintenance Costs:

Expansion tanks replaced at the parsonage as part of plumbing system maintenance.

Finance Decision:

Motion: Chloe Getz moved to approve the February financial report.

Second: Dawn Oswald

Decision: Motion passed unanimously.

Financial Management Policy Proposal – Barry Tobias

Barry presented a proposal to improve the church's financial management structure.

Primary goals of proposal:

Improve clarity and transparency of church finances.

Provide better long-term planning framework.

Allow flexibility when addressing building or operational needs.

Current financial structure includes several separate funds:

Missions fund.

Parsonage reserve fund.

Building replacement reserve.

Daycare funds.

Tax reserve fund.

General operating fund.

Proposed adjustments:

Combine certain building-related reserves into a unified building reserve category.

Maintain flexibility when funding repairs or capital improvements.

General Operating Fund Strategy:

Redirect approximately 4% of weekly giving to strengthen the operating fund.

Goal of building an operating reserve of approximately \$80,000.

Represents roughly two months of operating expenses.

Mortgage Strategy Discussion:

Once mortgage is paid off, funds currently used for mortgage payments could be redirected.

Potential uses include capital improvements or ministry expansion.

Daycare Grant Funds:

Approximately \$5,500 identified as restricted grant funds.

These funds must remain designated for daycare purposes.

Financial Dashboard Proposal:

Barry proposed developing a simplified dashboard showing key financial indicators.

Dashboard would include general fund balance, reserve balances, mortgage status, and financial trends.

Facilities Update – Larry Orwig

Volunteer team conducted deep cleaning of fellowship hall floors.

Volunteers included Larry Orwig and Muriel Slenker.

Cleaning used church floor equipment to scrub and restore flooring surfaces.

Significant improvement in appearance and sanitation noted.

Future cleaning projects identified:

Parish hallways.

Classrooms and additional building spaces.

Remaining sections of fellowship hall.

Parsonage Plumbing Discussion

Recurring plumbing clogs reported at the parsonage.

Problem believed to be caused by aging cast-iron piping.

Interior pipe corrosion may be catching debris and causing blockages.

Potential solutions discussed:

Professional sewer jet cleaning.

Purchasing a commercial power auger for in-house maintenance.

Cost comparison:

Rental auger approximately \$93 per use.

Purchase of professional auger estimated between \$600 and \$700.

Equipment and Maintenance Updates

Scissor lift repairs completed.

New batteries installed.

Battery charger installed.

Electrical switch replaced.

Total repair cost approximately \$791.

There was a \$1,500 donation toward repairs.

Walk-in refrigerator repaired by volunteers.

Volunteer repair prevented estimated \$3,000+ contractor expense.

Cleaning equipment maintenance:

Vacuum filters replaced.

Spare filters purchased to allow rotation and extended equipment life.

Cleaning Company Evaluation

Debi Deller met with three cleaning service providers.

Companies evaluated included ICX Cleaning Services, Tier One Cleaning, and Markey's Cleaning Services.

Evaluation criteria:

Professionalism and reliability.

Scope of services offered.

Pricing structure.

Contract requirements.

Recommendation: ICX Cleaning Services.

Company demonstrated strong professionalism and flexibility.

Service structure allowed additional deep cleaning tasks.

No long-term contract requirement.

Estimated monthly cost approximately \$1,470.

Decision:

Motion: Arnie Fritzius moved to approve contracting ICX Cleaning Services.

Second: Bruce Bailey

Decision: Motion passed unanimously.

Old Business

Exterior signage project for Parish Hall remains under review.

Letter sizing options being evaluated to ensure visibility from parking lot.

Final approval expected after reviewing scale samples.

Church Text Notification System (see separate article also)

Church leadership now has ability to send mass text alerts.

Primary intended uses:

Weather cancellations.

Emergency notifications.

Important service announcements.

New Business

Phone system modernization proposal expected at April council meeting.

Updated system expected to improve communication reliability.

Volunteers may assist with wiring installation to reduce costs.

Closing Reflections and Prayer

Council reflected on the stability and continued ministry of Chapel Church.

Members expressed gratitude for dedicated volunteers and faithful stewardship.

Meeting concluded with prayer led by Arnie Fritzius.

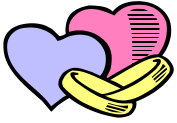
