Hello Chapel Family!

This year in the Children's Ministry, our focus is intentionality. Understand, this is more than being intentional, which is reactive; intentionality is a proactive, mental state of being and is necessary for change. It requires thought and commitment – it is a framework. We cannot be reactive when working with children. When we are reactive, we find ourselves scrambling; when we are proactive, we already have solutions in place. These kids live in a world that tells them so many lies – for this alone we must be proactive. Reactivity also doesn't allow for active listening, which is so important for our children. Active listening allows us to truly be present for the children. It allows the children to engage, ask questions, be curious – this creates a space for them to build a relationship with Jesus instead of seeing church as something they do because mom or dad tells them. Childhood is a critical point in our lives – it truly is the foundation for every response you will ever have.

Early in January, I attended a conference, the Children's Pastors Conference (CPC), where I learned so many valuable things about kid ministries. I was so blessed to have gone and with God's hand, made it there safely. I worshiped with people from around the globe, met individuals in nearly identical situations, and fangirled over meeting the author of The Adapted Word – a resource I use weekly for those with special needs. I could write (or being Italian rather talk) for days about my experience, but I will contain myself, mentioning a few details.

First, I learned just how pivotal a children's ministry is to the local church as well as the Church of Christ. Sometimes as churches, we push the children aside. We see them as a hindrance to our relationship with God. Psalm 8:1-2 says:

> "¹ Lord, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth! You have set your glory in the heavens.
> ² Through the praise of children and infants you have established a stronghold against your enemies, to silence the foe and the avenger."

Those noises that upset so many – the cries, the shouts, the laughs – those are praises to God. Perhaps it's no wonder why growing churches have successful children's ministries – the kids' voices are praise God uses! How amazing?! And if you have not taught a child's class before, I strongly urge you do so before assuming you will learn nothing. I am not sure what is more humbling than having to tell a child who has a HUGE question "I don't know the answer to that, let's find out together"! But friends, this is so important for our children! Recognize, we do not know it all, no matter how much we prepare. Jesus was not joking when he said you must have a childlike faith to enter the kingdom of heaven (Matthew 18:2-5). Another take away from the conference is the need to join forces with other churches for the greater good of the Church of Christ. We can have a church without a building, BUT we cannot have a church without people. When we work together with other churches to serve the community, we show the community we are united in Jesus. We are outraged by the world being divided, but are we outraged that we as a church are divided (1 Corinthians 1:10)? I expect the world to be divided. When the fruit was eaten, we divided – we blamed, we pointed fingers. Do not be surprised by division in this world (1 John 5:19). This is Satan's realm! Be outraged that we as Christians are fighting each other. Satan comes to separate – through God alone we may stand united against evil.

As I mentioned earlier, this year our focus is intentionality. I urge us all as a church to prayerfully consider these aforementioned points. Pray for God's guidance – we are moving when he tells us (Numbers 10:11-36). Pray for vigilance, courage, and comfort – fear is of the devil (Psalm 23, Acts 17:28, 2 Timothy 1:7, 1 Peter 5:8). Pray for open hearts and minds in the community, in our church, in our children – we are called to plant seeds and we will (Hosea 10:12, Romans 12:2, Philippians 4:7). Pray for healing – we of all ages come broken and hurt from a world of chaos; before redemption we are all children of sin (Ephesians 2:1-3). Pray for renewed eyes – we will see the hurt in everyone knowing the enemy is not human although we humans are still accountable for our actions (Ephesians 4:14, 6:12). Pray for love – through God alone, we may love others (Ephesians 2:8-10, 1John 3:16-18).
