Hello Chapel Family!

I have a confession – I love June. This month (usually) guarantees warm weather without the sweltering heat of summer. It's usually when my garden starts to pop, and I spend a lot of my time outdoors. It begins the season of some of my favorite foods and of course some of my favorite smells, meat on a grill followed closely by bonfire.

As I look around, I see there are so many reasons to be excited for this month. Children are out for the summer, getting ready to move up to the next grade. Seniors are graduating high school, getting ready to start a brand-new chapter in their lives. College grads are looking for jobs and starting their careers. Families are getting ready to spend more intentional time together. Many adults are starting new jobs, changing jobs, and retiring!

All of these things are exciting and should be celebrated. But with this excitement can come a lot of unknowns. A new grade with new students and a new teacher can certainly induce anxiety in even our youngest friends, but more than this. Summertime for some students may look like less food and more abuse. Graduating and going to college or finding a job comes with whole host of new responsibilities and sometimes, a questioning of faith. Family vacations can have their own problems and parents will probably come home more tired than when they left. And retiring, I cannot even imagine the what-ifs that come with this.

My husband and I did a vacation early (and without the kids) this year. We had the amazing opportunity to visit a Spanish island in May. While there, we had the blessing of attending two church services at a multi-denominational church (similar to our version of a non-denominational church). I don't believe in coincidences – I know we have free-will, but I truly believe God's hand guides our narrative. The first Sunday, the message was about the importance of the wait, the desert, the wilderness. I am not sure how many of you are aware of the circumstance my family is currently in, but in short, we are enduring a HEAVY season of waiting. I cannot help but believe God's will was

behind every second of that perfectly timed message. And then we chose to spend several hours of our vacation getting to know people from this congregation and oh my heart! How encouraging to hear testimonies, to witness how God's hand has provided, and to join in praises to our God all with complete strangers. They have been praying for not only our family but Chapel Church as well and truly I feel so blessed to have met them all.

One of the things that stuck with me the most though is just how these beautiful individuals prayed for each other. The pastor of the church has Parkinson's disease – his condition has been unstable so he's been unable to preach for quite some time now. Having a particularly difficult day the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday, he stayed home, and his wife attended alone and upset. Members gathered around her and prayed over her, but they didn't ask for God to ease her discomfort with the situation. Instead this is what was prayed,

“This road hasn't been easy, and it will not be easier. And God, that's okay. We are here for your glory.”

I will full on admit, I have never heard someone pray over someone like that. Honestly, have you? Have you been able to say, “God this hardship is for your glory”? Are we able to pray over each other like this? Are we WILLING to be vulnerable enough with each other to let others know our true struggles? Are we willing to be weak to allow God's true goodness and glory to shine through? How often do we actually see our hardships as blessings?

Friends, this month, I am giving us all homework, and it is two-fold. First, I encourage you to reach out to one or two people, with whom you don't normally talk, and ask how you can pray for them. This can be by letter, email, text, in-person, etc. Uncomfortable, I know. But our church is going through an awakening and this means a lot of discomfort will be coming. Cutting branches causes stress, losing a limb causes pain – so know now, growing will not be comfortable AND THAT IS OKAY! It is necessary. The second piece is reaching out to one person who is in a changing point of their life. The aforementioned milestones are so exciting, but can be so stressful. Let us show each other compassion, support, grace, and love as we encourage one another with God's sovereign and faithful hands.

Honestly, who wouldn't want that?

## Young Adults!



# June 2025 Report from Debt Elimination Team

**From \$525,893 to \$226,019.69**

May was a busy month with \$\$\$\$ to lower the mortgage indebtedness . . . scrap metal, “noisy loose change”, online sales, apple dumplings and private contributions. One year ago we reported the balance as \$334,934 . . . . . now it’s **over** one hundred thousand dollars less . . . and nearly three hundred thousand dollars less than when we started!!!! Friends: thank God for what He’s doing thru His people at Chapel Church. “Each person should do as he has decided in his heart—not reluctantly or out of necessity, for God loves a cheerful giver.” –II Corinthians 9:7
