### 165 Celebration Campaign in Progress!!

On September 17, 2023, the Debt Elimination Team launched its first in a series of actions aimed at eliminating Chapel Church's mortgage debt. The **165 Celebration Campaign**, coinciding with the <u>165<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of</u> Chapel Church and endorsed by the Leadership Team, will remain in force through October 29, 2023.

### **Details of the Campaign:**

- Chapel Church members/attendees are asked to prayerfully consider selecting one or more of the 165 specially marked envelopes from the campaign basket that is placed in the church narthex prior to the 8:00 service through the Sunday School hour and in the Parish Building prior to and during the 10:30 service.
- **Fill each selected envelope with \$165** (or more!) and return the filled envelope(s) to Chapel Church <u>on</u> <u>or before October 29, 2023,</u> by depositing them in the 8:00 service offering plate or the 10:30 service offering box.
- Sunday School classes, prayer groups, and ministry groups may also choose to "adopt" one or more "165" envelope(s) and collectively pool their resources to satisfy the envelope amount.
- E-tithing does not apply to the "165" Campaign. <u>Cash or personal checks are being accepted as the payment method for this special offering.</u> Your \$165 donation and your normal weekly giving amount need to be kept separate, with your regular giving amount being remitted in your usual manner and your \$165 donation remitted in the specially marked envelopes. (For those who use the envelope method for your regular giving, there is an area on the "165" envelope to list your Envelope Giving Number for tax purposes.)
- Individuals unable to attend services in person but desiring to participate in this special campaign may mail their donation to the church office <u>prior to October 29<sup>th</sup></u>. Checks should be made payable to Chapel Church and include "165 Celebration Campaign" in the memo section. For each multiple of \$165 remitted, an equivalent number of special "165" campaign envelope(s) will be removed from the campaign basket on your behalf.

At the end of the campaign, when all 165 envelopes, each filled with \$165, have been returned to Chapel Church, the special offering amount will total \$27,225 – with 100% of your gifts being applied directly to Chapel's mortgage debt!!! To God Be the Glory!!!

- The congregation will be able to visually follow the progress of the campaign as the number of envelopes in the basket steadily decreases. In addition, weekly updates of donations received will appear in the church bulletin.
