## **WHAT’S HAPPENING?**

We have had 2 full weekends of splitting up the older and younger children during Children’s Church and friends WHAT A DIFFERENCE!!!! Our classroom disruptions are minimal, and the focus has been on God! As of right now, we will continue to start children in worship with their parents/guardians. They will continue to receive a snack and water on their way into service and should be utilizing the facilities before coming to Children’s Church.

**Parents and guardians:** As a parent myself, I understand the difficulty with listening to the sermon while parenting. We want to listen but our second born poking our first born in the ear trying to pick a fight prevails. Or our child has to use the bathroom just as the speaker is starting to dive deeper. Or our child won’t stop fidgeting, tapping, talking, sighing, hitting, crying, crawling, etc. Guess what? It is okay. Parents, our primary mission field is our family, our children! Having them join adults for service is important just as Children’s Church is important. Here are some tips and tricks to help you out!

1. Prep your children the night before. Let them know they will be sitting with you and your expectations of them. Remind them of their 3 classroom rules: Respect God and his word, Respect teachers and leaders, Respect each other.
2. Before church, let your child(ren) play outside. It is okay if they come a little messy. Letting them release some wiggles beforehand helps them to sit.
3. Feed them before you come!
4. Have them go to the bathroom BEFORE heading into the church to worship. Set the standard that there will be no bathroom breaks once service starts. Obviously emergencies happen, but set the expectation.
5. Be strategic with your seats! Sit somewhere they can see! This is so important especially for our readers! They love to see what is happening and it makes it easier for them to follow along! Sit somewhere they can focus! Up front gives them little distractions. Sit with other people you know would be willing to take on guiding your child if you have to step out. Consider separating your children or even swapping with another parent (psst...I have used this one myself).
6. Make use of the binders and Bibles provided! These binders contain pencils, crayons, blank sermon notes, and coloring sheets. These binders are for you to work WITH your

child during service. If you have a reader and writer, work through a sermon notes sheet. If you have a younger child, give them small goals to achieve during the sermon. It is never too early to have them listen for the number of times the speaker says “Jesus” or “God” or “love” or “sin”. Set a (quiet) timer and have them listen for 2 minutes and then color for 5 minutes.


7. And lastly, reward those kiddos! It is tough to sit and listen. We adults don’t even like to sit and listen. Give them grace, let them know you are proud of them, and speak truth into them.

### **NEEDS:**

Splitting children’s church means we need additional volunteers to help in the classroom! We are required to have two adults per group of children. We are asking for a once-a-month commitment in the classroom during the 1<sup>st</sup> and/or 2<sup>nd</sup> hour. Please pray about this!

***From \$525,893 to \$198,626***

***New Goal: reaching for ¾ to paid***

***The 2025 Car Show did it!!!!*** – With the \$4,550 profit, the 2025 Car Show pushed the mortgage figure below two hundred thousand. ***A big shoutout to Whitey Breeden*** for leading the way and ***to ALL*** who helped in any way to make the 2025 car show another success – your time, donations/purchases of food, baked goods, silent auction items, books and car wash coupons. We're sorry Whitey was in the hospital the day of the show . . . prayers appreciated for a full recovery.

\*\*\*\*\* ***Interesting fact:*** it was the car show in 2024 that pushed the mortgage below the three hundred thousand mark! \*\*\*\*\*

***Fall Brick Envelope Wall Campaign of Giving:*** We are in the midst of this campaign . . . watch the envelopes disappear from the “walls” in the church narthex and portable wall in the parish building. Gift Cards will be distributed on **Sunday, November 23, 2025** in time for Black Friday sales. Checks made out to Chapel Church must accompany the orders.

18 South Youth Center serves teenagers in 7th-12th grades in the community by providing targeted programming to promote healthy personal, emotional, social, and educational growth in a safe environment. They meet all teenagers where they are at, regardless of background, history, or situation.

One of the many things 18S does for community kids is help to meet their basic needs – things many of us take for granted.

- Meals = Chapel has a team that cooks each month so the kids have at least 1 hot meal a day. This past summer, the Chapel Ladies Bible study group provided bagged breakfasts throughout the weeks and lunches for the center's weekly Wednesday field trips.  
***Chapel is the sole organization providing consistent meal support for the youth center. THANK YOU!!***
- The Closet = Chapel hosted a personal hygiene products collection in the month of September to benefit the kids. In addition to personal hygiene products, The Closet also contains food and household items, teen clothing, shoes, and coats.
- Hair Salon – An 18S staff member is a licensed cosmetologist. She provides free professional haircuts, colorings, and styling services to the local teens. Hair and makeup appointments for prom, homecoming, or other special occasions can be made at the center.
- School supplies - These are available at no cost to students throughout the year.

### **But there's MORE the Center needs in order to further assist students.**

- Laundry – Image not being able to wash and dry your clothes! Students in our community face this! 18S has a washer and dryer but needs financial assistance to have an electrical panel installed and to finish hook up. **Approximate cost = \$2,000.**
- Emergency Shower – Just as Chapel has a much-needed shower ministry in the Parish Building since adults in the community don't have access to showers, the youth of our community face this same issue! Financial assistance is needed to complete the shower installation at the Center. **Approximate cost = \$1,500.**



The areas include:

Scenery/Decor/Signs (*needed by first or second weekend in December*) \*preparing the backdrop for the Magi scene

\*preparing the bandstand for the Angel scene

\*preparing the Nativity scene

\*preparing the signage for each area - mostly scripture related but also traffic related (*some supplies are available; other supplies will be resourced as needed*)

## **Northeast Global Methodist Laity Equipping Team**

'Through the empowerment of the Holy Spirit, the Global Methodist Church envisions multiplying disciples of Jesus Christ throughout the earth who flourish in scriptural holiness as we worship passionately, love extravagantly, and witness boldly.'

Our Northeast Global Methodist Laity Equipping Team has been working diligently behind the scenes for the past two years to provide on-line classes for any lay person who desires to dig deeper into their study of scripture, discipleship, prayer, congregational care and support, as well as our Methodist heritage and foundational doctrines, plus much more.

Perhaps you have been searching for personal growth opportunities.

Classes are underway and are available at the low cost of 20\$ per subject (plus certain book resources as needed). Each subject is offered on-line with qualified instructors leading you through small group interaction weekly for a series of, typically, five or six weeks [one night/week for a total of not less than ten to fifteen hours, depending on the subject].

This is not about 'filling the pulpit' or 'going into ministry' or 'becoming a speaker' and it is not about 'becoming a Certified Lay Minister'. However, if God is tugging at your heart, or tugs a bit as you grow in your faith, most of the classes offered could be credited toward becoming a CLM. Lots of options!

These classes are available to anyone who is searching for a deeper understanding of the Bible and how might God be leading you to share your faith with one other person as we interact each day with so many who might not know anything about how much God loves them. Perhaps you are wondering 'What exactly are the foundations of Methodism?' and 'Who was John Wesley?' or 'How can I disciple others in our faith walk together?'


