WHAT’S HAPPENING?

As always with children, the need for flexibility is **ESSENTIAL**. After speaking with volunteers, parents, and children, our Children’s Ministry is revamping their Sunday programming for the elementary children. Our aim is to minimize classroom disruptions so we can focus on worship, prayer, and building a truly solid foundation on Biblical truth.

Over the next several months, our children’s programming will be transitioning from a Sunday School and Children’s Church model to a combined 1st hour and 2nd hour program. Through observation, we recognize a strong attendance of children joining for the 2nd hour only. Unfortunately, our current set up allows for a very limited teaching timeframe. God has put it on our hearts to do better.

The following is the **ultimate** goal:

During our first hour, the children will be worshipping God, playing a game, prayer journaling, and if time allows, watch a **short** video introducing the topic in the next hour. Our 1st hour will end at 10:25am. Children who attended the 1st hour will remain in the classroom. At this time, children for the 2nd hour will begin joining the classroom as well. During this time, children will use the bathroom, get a drink, and eat a snack. The 2nd hour will begin with more worship followed by a splitting of the older and younger elementary kids into different classrooms. The lesson will be age appropriate and will be followed with an activity, game, or craft. The kids will end the morning with another worship song, ending at 11:30am.


Parents and guardians: As of now, children will continue joining you in worship. Children will be given a snack and water during this time. Please encourage them to use the bathroom BEFORE coming for the 2nd hour of programming as this helps us stay on track with learning. Please, understand this time is very important for your child(ren). Just as in school, if you NEED to remove your child earlier from either hour, please notify the teacher beforehand. Every time the door opens unexpectedly, the whole classroom is disrupted and takes time to settle, which means we are keeping ALL the children from learning about God. We will work towards putting a sign in the window of the door when the children are ready for dismissal! Thank you for your cooperation and understanding!

NEEDS:

Splitting children’s church means we need additional volunteers to help in the classroom, NOT teach! We are required to have two adults per group of children. We are asking for a once-a-month commitment in the classroom during the 1st and/or 2nd hour. Please pray about this!



Coming in September . . . “Fall Brick Wall Campaign of Giving”

Please take a few minutes to review the mortgage balance on the DET September update page. It is quite impressive to see the substantial reduction in our debt within a period of less than 24 months. Thank you, Chapel Church, for your generous contributions and ALL PRAISE and GLORY to God for His goodness and faithfulness to Chapel Church!

The Debt Elimination Team will be launching another exciting opportunity to further reduce Chapel’s mortgage debt beginning September 14 and continuing through October 26: envelopes symbolizing “bricks” will be affixed to the brick wall in the church narthex with an equal number of “bricks” displayed on a portable wall in the Parish Building. Each envelope will list a dollar amount indicating the contribution to be placed inside. Individuals, families, groups, or classes (children, youth and adults) can select an envelope (or several envelopes!!!) corresponding to the desired contribution amount from either of the walls. Simply insert cash or a check for the specified amount into the envelope and place it in the offering plate or one of the donation boxes located in either building.

We know that you will want to stay informed about the progress of the Brick Wall Campaign. Therefore, as the filled envelopes begin to pour in, we will provide weekly updates. Additionally, you will have the opportunity to visually track the campaign's advancement as you monitor the number of “bricks” removed from the walls.

Please keep in mind the following: (1) The amount in your “brick” envelope is a special debt reduction offering, separate from your regular weekly giving. (2) Your Brick Wall Campaign offering should be placed in the marked envelopes, while your regular giving continues as usual. (3) For those using envelopes for regular giving, you can list your Envelope Giving Number on the Brick Wall Campaign envelope for tax purposes. (4) Yes, you can give anonymously! (5) Fill as many envelopes as you desire.

Your enthusiasm and participation in this campaign will directly contribute to the financial health and future of our Chapel community. Every single “brick” removed symbolizes a step closer to a debt-free future, empowering us to allocate resources towards ministry, outreach, and other vital programs. By working together, we can achieve something truly remarkable, leaving a lasting legacy for generations to come.
