ANNOUNCEMENTS CONTINUED

Highlights from the December 4, 2022 Annual Voters' Assembly Meeting:

- 59 persons attended. Three sets of minutes were approved: the regular meeting of December 5, 2021 and two special meetings of March 7, 2021 and May 15, 2022.
- The following were ratified as directors: Marty Albers, Alan Fruend, Jim Koch, Patrice Skellet, and Gary Timm; and as elders: Jim Crosier, Craig Schlichtmann, Stan Schwede. Gene Weidner, and Jay Zvirzgdins. All will serve 3-year terms starting in January.
- The Personnel Committee has recommended adding an Associate Pastor position, with a focus on youth and young adult ministry including Summer Camp, but also shut-in and hospital calls and preaching. We plan to call a graduating student from the St. Louis seminary. A call committee has been formed.
- The General Fund budget of \$713,740 was approved for 2023.
- Membership stands at 897 as of November 30, 2022.
- Reports were presented by all staff members.

Calling of Associate Pastor: The departure of Pastor Marriott this summer has made it clear that additional pastoral assistance is needed. After a comprehensive look at the options, the Personnel Committee believes that a Seminary Call is the best approach. The Seminary's process requires applications be submitted by February 1, 2023, with interviews of potential candidates occurring in January and February. If God leads the Call Committee to a potential candidate, a meeting of the Voters' Assembly will be held to discuss the candidate and vote on whether to extend a Call. This is a short timeline and we trust that you appreciate the need for swift action.

The Call Committee wants to be as inclusive as possible and so we invite the congregation to contribute suggestions, concerns, potential interview questions for the candidates, and possible names of qualified pastoral candidates. This is very time-sensitive so your feedback needs to be submitted by Sunday, December 18. You may respond by email at office@chapelofthecross.org or via a handwritten note to the church office.

Copies of the Job Description developed by the Personnel Committee are available at the Welcome Center with contact information for the Call Committee. We encourage you to reach out to discuss this exciting and important process for our congregation. Most importantly, we ask you to pray for God's direction and guiding hand to the Call Committee and for our congregation as we chart the future. We will be providing regular updates on the process as it unfolds.
