Mortgage Burning On January 27, 2025, Chapel officially paid off our mortgage. With God's great blessings and the faithful giving of our members, Chapel of the Cross is debt-free for the first time in our 60-year history! We will hold a special ceremony to publicly offer our thanks to God for His guidance in achieving this incredible milestone during the 11:00 a.m. worship service on March 30th. This will include a symbolic burning of our mortgage paperwork. A prayer of thanksgiving will be offered during the other services that weekend.

Paying off this mortgage does not represent an end of something as much as it marks a new era of opportunity and challenge. As President Schmidt mentioned in December, continued giving to the Capital or Building Funds will be essential to create a reserve to meet the challenge of future maintenance/repair projects. The first project of 2025 has already presented itself. Nearly \$40,000 is needed to repair or replace many of our most widely used doors, including those in the gym. This project will also add an automatic system to the main upstairs bathrooms for easier access. After an individual gift of \$8,000, we will cover the rest through the Capital Fund. Thanks be to God! We know we will take on other significant projects in order to maintain our exceptional facility. We also trust that God will continue to lead us to new and important ministry opportunities. With God's help, continued giving to the Capital Fund will allow us to maintain our debtfree status as we return to Him some of the bounty that He has first showered on us.
