Helping Hands Food Pantry: During the COVID-19 pandemic we are still serving our neighbors with drive through food pick up on Thursday.

We received a \$550 grant from St. Louis Area Foodbank to purchase a pop-up canopy and 3 8 foot tables to use during food distribution and butter, cheese and milk

We are purchasing some items from St. Louis Area Food Bank at a greatly reduced rate. Operation Food Search supplies us with food from area grocery stores; meat, bread, fresh produce, soft drinks and sports drinks. We are still purchasing, with monetary donations, some dry and canned goods; side dishes, pasta, tuna, jelly, from local grocery stores that we can't get from the food banks.

The Girl Scout April Showers was postponed this spring so we are running low on shampoo, conditioners, body wash, lotion, toothpaste and toothbrushes, shaving cream and razors.

If you would like to make a monetary donation, send it to the church with Food Pantry on the memo line. Food items (no glass) and health and beauty supplies can be dropped off at the church and placed in the grocery cart. We could also use volunteers, call Diane Timm for more information.

Life Thought: What best prepares us to defend the sanctity of life? Political strategy? Graphic imagery? Rhetorical formulas? Scientific citations? How about the hope we have in Christ our Holy One (1 Peter 3:15) – that our Lord is at work in every circumstance, even those life-and-death moments that seem most dark and desperate, bringing about not just survival but everlasting salvation, and always with His signature gentleness.

Helping Individuals with Mental Health Problems:

Myth 8: I can't do anything for a person with a mental health problem.

Fact: Friends and loved ones can make a big difference. Only 44% of adults with diagnosable mental health problems and less than 20% of children and adolescents receive needed treatment. Friends and family can be important influences to help someone get the treatment and services they need by:

Reaching out and letting them know you are available to help. Helping them access mental health services. Learning and sharing the facts about mental health, especially if you hear something that isn't true. Treating them with respect, just as you would anyone else. Refusing to define them by their diagnosis or using labels such as "crazy."

COTC Thoughts: During His ministry Jesus spent time with those who were sick, touched them, and ate with them. In Matthew 11:28-29, Jesus encourages those who are weary and burdened to come to Him for rest. James 5:13-14 exhorts us to pray for the sick. Prayer is a tremendously strong way of bringing our concerns for each other to God.

This week we will combine the previous three weeks' passages from Psalm 62, which remind us where our strength and hope lies as we live in the craziness of these days.

My soul finds rest in God alone; my salvation comes from him. He alone is my rock and my salvation; he is my fortress, I will never be shaken. How long will you assault a man? Would all of you throw him down-- this leaning wall, this tottering fence? They fully intend to topple him from his lofty place; they take delight in lies. With their mouths they bless, but in their hearts they curse. Find rest, O my soul, in God alone; my hope comes from him. He alone is my rock and my salvation; he is my fortress, I will not be shaken. My salvation and my honor depend on God; he is my mighty rock, my refuge. Trust in him at all times, O people; pour out your hearts to him, for God is our refuge."
