Greetings from the Helping Hands Food Pantry! Our summer has been very busy as our numbers continue to increase, and we are seeing more new families who have never been to a food pantry.

This year from January through the middle of June we have ordered 11,545 pounds of food from St. Louis Area Food Bank. Most of the food we receive is free but the food we pay for is under the local area stores' cost. We continue to receive food like fresh produce, canned and dry goods and meat from Operation Food Search. We pick up food from Sav-a-lot, Schnucks, Panera and Starbucks. We still receive food once a month from St. Joseph of Cottleville.


LADIES' BIBLE STUDY

A NEW GENERATION IS COMING TO FAITH IN JESUS CHRIST THROUGH OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD AND ITS FOLLOW-UP PROGRAM, THE GREATEST JOURNEY.

Light, sky, land, and water appeared out of nothing. Next came vegetation, animals, and mankind. God called forth all these things simply by speaking, "Let there be..." (Genesis 1). While the story of creation may sound familiar, it is an entirely new concept for many boys and girls in Mongolia.

"The first lesson is always exciting for me to teach, because it is a very different idea that the world was created by God," said Buyankhishig, a church leader. "Mongolia was a communist country, and Darwin's theory was taught—that our origin is from a monkey."



Munkhbold, 11, and Enkhriilen, 9, were among the children who received Christ into their lives during The Greatest Journey course at Living Stone Church. They each independently noted on their graduation day that Genesis 1:27 was their favorite of all the memory verses in the course

The Greatest Journey discipleship program has its beginning in the evangelistic outreaches where Operation Christmas Child shoebox gifts are distributed.

"Every year, our church gets between 50 and 100 shoeboxes, which means we have the opportunity to reach 50 to 100 children and their families," Buyankhishig said. "Shoeboxes actually help open people's hearts."

This is the simple beauty of God's Plan through the OCC Shoebox Ministry. FOLDS OF THE FLAG

If you've ever attended a military funeral or seen one on TV, the flag folding is one of the more impressive parts of the ceremony. As with all things in the military, the flag is handled with utmost precision and discipline. We have a precise method of reason and how we fold the flag

before presenting it to whomever the next of kin is. The flag handlers for the flag are half twice along its length, and then, beginning at the end away from the blue field, fold the flag in triangles until the flag is formed into a triangle "0" with the field showing on the outside. Traditional flag folding dictates a total of 13 folds for an American flag, regardless of the size. Over time, each of the folds has been given a meaning.

The 13 folds mean this:

- 1. Symbolizes life and its importance.
- 2. Signifies our belief in eternal life.
- 3. Honor and tribute to the veteran departing our ranks in defending their country.
- 4. Symbolizes our weaker nature and reminds us that we are citizens trusting and searching for guidance in war and peace.
- 5. An acknowledgment in tribute to our country.
- 6. In honor of where our hearts lie as we pledge allegiance to the flag.
- 7. Tribute to the Armed Forces to protect our country.
- 8. Tribute to the one who entered the valley of the shadow of death and an honor to mothers for whom the flag flies on Mother's Day.

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PUFFINS AND THE GOOD AND PERFECT GIFT

"Do not be deceived, my beloved brothers. Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change" (James 1: 16-17).

God has truly blessed me with many "good and perfect" gifts in my 70 plus years of life. I could create a very long list that includes my faith, my family and friends, a job I loved, good health, and world travel ... endless perfect gifts! But as you might expect from the D.V.M. after my name, one of the things that tops any list is God's incredibly beautiful and complex creation, especially the animals. The incredible complexity of the human body is another of the many marvels that the world ignores in their pursuit of personal freedom and their own ideologies. God says to us in His creation, "Look at yourself! You are incredibly made. How can you doubt my presence?"

"For his invisible attributes, namely, his eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly perceived, ever since the creation of the world, in the things that have been made ..." (Romans 1:20).

So, the "things that have been made" include the Atlantic Puffin. It's the beak, right? Without the beak

they are just another black and white bird. God made puffins to make us laugh. He made puffins to get us to take a second look at His creation. Pretty hard to ignore a puffin. He made puffins as a "good and perfect gift" to bring us pure joy. God desires us to look at all His creation with new eyes and to see the beauty He created for us because He is the Father of lights. He is unchanging in His love for us.

We desperately need our Father of lights. When life around us is dark and despairing, when troubles are real and overwhelming, when our hurts outweigh our joys, take a moment to think about God's beautiful creation given for us as a "good and perfect gift." Take a moment to remember that we have another Light in our world—our Lord Jesus Who is the Creator of all things and is the light of men.

"[The Word] was in the beginning with God. All things were made through him, and without him was not anything made that was made. In him was life, and the life was the light of men" (John 1:2-4).

We know that life will continue to throw bad things our way, so every so often, let us take a moment to admire God's creation that surrounds us—and remember the puffin! †††

TWO WORDS THAT ARE NOT PART OF GOD'S VOCABULARY

The title probably caught your attention but I truly believe there are two words that God never uses. The fact that God never uses these two words is pure Gospel for us.

One word that God never uses is INSIGNIFICANT. Psalm 147:4 reminds us that God knows the number of the stars and even has names for each of the stars. The most distant stars are not insignificant to God. In Matthew 6:25-34, Jesus tells us not to be anxious. Jesus tells us that God feeds the birds of the air. Jesus goes on to tell us that God clothes the grass of the field. The birds of the air and the lilies of the field are not insignificant to God. The point is that each and every one of us is tremendously significant to God. In Matthew 10:29-31, Jesus tells us that no sparrow falls to the ground without God's knowledge. Even sparrows are not insignificant to God. The point of Jesus' words are how highly significant we are in God's sight.

Genesis tells us that God created all things out of nothing by His Word. There is only one exception to this. God created man by forming him from the dust of the ground. God then breathed life into man. God created mankind as the crown of His creation and placed us as stewards over His creation. We are to care for the earth and make wise use of the earth. Mankind is highly significant to God! That means that every human being is significant and special to God as an individual. Our age does not matter to God. Both young and old (and middle aged) are significant to God. Our talents and abilities are gifts that God has given to each of us. He has not created all of us to have exactly the same talents and abilities. No matter what your individual talents and abilities are, they are special and significant to God. Our sex does not matter to God. God treasures both men and women tremendously. Our place of origin does not matter to God. All individuals from every place and every culture are special to God. God treasures each individual human being no matter what our financial standing and possessions. We are all highly significant to God and we always have been and we always will be.

How significant is each individual human being? God the Father sent His only Son, Jesus, to save each and every one of us. God wants each one of us in heaven with Him for all eternity. I would venture that makes us very significant, each and every one of us. Nothing we can do would make us significant to God. His tremendous love makes us significant. God the Holy Spirit is active in our lives daily. He guides us as we

learn the Scriptures. He plants faith in our heart and grows that faith. He places good deeds before us to do. Ephesians 2:10 tells us that we are His workmanship, created for good works which God prepared beforehand. Many times, we fail to do the good works that God has designed for us and we simply ask for His forgiveness and guidance. Always remember that we are so significant to God that He chose to dwell within us!

A second word that God never uses is SURPRISED. Absolutely nothing can surprise God, God knows all things and has known all things for all eternity. Psalm 139 is full of references to God's eternal knowledge of every tiny detail in our lives. Verse 2 tells us that God knows when we sit down and when we rise up. He knows all of our thoughts. Verse 4 tells us that God knows our words even before we say them. God knows all about each and every one of us. Verses 13-16 reminds us that God knit us together in our mother's womb (well before anyone else knew anything about us). Jeremiah 1:5 teaches that God knew us before He formed us in the womb. He had plans for us before we were born. God knows our every heartbeat and every breath. He has known each of them from before creation! That is an amazing concept. God knows each of our thoughts, all of our words, and each of our actions. He has known each of these for all time! And yet, knowing our evil thoughts, words, and actions did not cause Him to abandon us. Jesus knew before creation that mankind would fall into sin and continue to sin. He still created each and every one of us. He always knew that it would cost him a lifetime of humiliation, suffering, and pain. He knew from before eternity that Judas would betray Him. He knew from before eternity that Peter would deny Him. He knew that He would be beaten, mocked and crucified. Absolutely none of this was a surprise to lesus. lesus knew all of this before creation. 2 Timothy 1:9 states that God's plan of salvation was set before the ages began. The tremendous love that Jesus has for God the Father and His tremendous love for us caused Him to follow through on the plan for our salvation. Absolutely no surprises at all!

All of this is pure Gospel for us! We are tremendously significant to God, no matter what anyone else thinks or says. Nothing that happens to us can surprise God. He knows every second of our life and makes all things work for our eternal good. Take comfort that God does not use the words INSIGNIFICANT or SURPRISED! ***

- 9. In honor of womanhood and their character that helped make this country great.
- 10. Is a tribute to fathers who sacrificed their children for our country



- 11. Represents the lower portion of the seal.
- 12. Represents the emblem of eternity.
- 13. The completely-folded flag with the stars exposed reminds us of our national motto, "In God We Trust."

The 13-fold procedure was standard long before meanings were assigned to each fold. In modern times, meanings have been assigned to each flag's fold. The source and date of the origin of these meanings remain a mystery, adding a layer of intrigue to the ceremony. The next time you see a flag folded, understanding the meanings of the folds can add a decisive touch to patriotic ceremonies. ***
