AS WE GATHER

Holy Trinity, a time we commemorate and celebrate, is different than any other recognized time in the Church Year. Unlike Christmas, Easter, or last week's Pentecost, where we rejoice in and reflect upon an action of God for our salvation, Holy Trinity is a time to rejoice in and reflect upon a *doctrine*. Even in the mystery of things we cannot fully understand or comprehend by our own reason, we trust God's revelation through His Word made known to us of who He is and what He has done, that apart from Him there is no other.

¹ Does not wisdom call out? Does not understanding raise her voice? ² On the heights along the way, where the paths meet, she takes her stand; ³ beside the gates leading into the city, at the entrances, she cries aloud: ⁴ "To you, O men, I call out; I raise my voice to all mankind.

¹⁴ Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice and addressed the crowd:

²² "Men of Israel, listen to this: Jesus of Nazareth was a man accredited by God to you by miracles, wonders and signs, which God did among you through him, as you yourselves know. ²³ This man was handed over to you by God's set purpose and foreknowledge; and you, with the help of wicked men, put him to death by nailing him to the cross. ²⁴ But God raised him from the dead, freeing him from the agony of death, because it was impossible for death to keep its hold on him. ²⁵ David said about him:

"'I saw the Lord always before me. Because he is at my right hand, I will not be shaken. ²⁶ Therefore my heart is glad and my tongue rejoices; my body also will live in hope, ²⁷ because you will not abandon me to the grave, nor will you let your Holy One see

decay. ²⁸ You have made known to me the paths of life; you will fill me with joy in your presence.'

²⁹ "Brothers, I can tell you confidently that the patriarch David died and was buried, and his tomb is here to this day. ³⁰ But he was a prophet and knew that God had promised him on oath that he would place one of his descendants on his throne. ³¹ Seeing what was ahead, he spoke of the resurrection of the Christ, that he was not abandoned to the grave, nor did his body see decay. ³² God has raised this Jesus to life, and we are all witnesses of the fact. ³³ Exalted to the right hand of God, he has received from the Father the promised Holy Spirit and has poured out what you now see and hear. ³⁴ For David did not ascend to heaven, and yet he said,

" 'The Lord said to my Lord: "Sit at my right hand 35 until I make your enemies a footstool for your feet." '

³⁶ "Therefore let all Israel be assured of this: God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, both Lord and Christ."

⁴⁸ The Jews answered him, "Aren't we right in saying that you are a Samaritan and demon-possessed?"

- ⁴⁹ "I am not possessed by a demon," said Jesus, "but I honor my Father and you dishonor me. ⁵⁰ I am not seeking glory for myself; but there is one who seeks it, and he is the judge. ⁵¹ I tell you the truth, if anyone keeps my word, he will never see death."
- ⁵² At this the Jews exclaimed, "Now we know that you are demon-possessed! Abraham died and so did the prophets, yet you say that if anyone keeps your word, he will never taste death. ⁵³ Are you greater than our father Abraham? He died, and so did the prophets. Who do you think you are?"
- ⁵⁴ Jesus replied, "If I glorify myself, my glory means nothing. My Father, whom you claim as your God, is the one who glorifies me. ⁵⁵ Though you do not know him, I know him. If I said I did not, I would be a liar like you, but I do know him and keep his word. ⁵⁶ Your father Abraham rejoiced at the thought of seeing my day; he saw it and was glad."
- ⁵⁷ "You are not yet fifty years old," the Jews said to him, "and you have seen Abraham!"
- ⁵⁸ "I tell you the truth," Jesus answered, "before Abraham was born, I am!" ⁵⁹ At this, they picked up stones to stone him, but Jesus hid himself, slipping away from the temple grounds.

ATHANASIAN CREED

Pastor: We confess the Triune God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit as we profess

portions of the ancient ecumenical creed written in the third century, on the basis of church father, Athanasius' teachings. Whoever will be saved shall, above all else, hold the catholic* faith ... (*universal)

People: And the catholic faith is this, that we worship one God in three persons

and three persons in one God, neither confusing the persons nor

dividing the substance.

Men: The Father is uncreated, incomprehensible, eternal.
Women: The Son is uncreated, incomprehensible, eternal.
People: The Spirit is uncreated, incomprehensible, eternal.

Pastor: So likewise the Father is almighty God, the Son is almighty God, and the

Holy Spirit is almighty God.

People: And yet they are not three Lords but one Lord.

Pastor: For we are compelled by the Christian truth to acknowledge every person

by Himself to be both God and Lord,

Men: So we cannot by the catholic faith say that there are three Gods or three

Lords ...

Women: There is one Father, not three Fathers; one Son, not three Sons; one

Holy Spirit, not three Holy Spirits.

Pastor: And in this Trinity none is before or after another; none is greater or less

than another; ... so that in all things ... the Unity in Trinity is to be

worshiped.

People: He, therefore, that will be saved is compelled thus to think of the

Trinity.

Pastor: Furthermore, it is necessary to everlasting salvation that he also believe

faithfully the incarnation of our Lord Jesus Christ. For the right faith is that we believe and confess that our Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is

God and man.

Men: Who suffered for our salvation, descended into hell, rose again the

third day from the dead.

Women: He ascended into heaven, He sits at the right hand of the Father, God

Almighty, from whence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

Men: At whose coming all men will rise again with their bodies and will give

an account of their own works.

Women: And they that have done good will go into life everlasting; and they

that have done evil, into everlasting fire.

Pastor: This is the catholic faith which, except a person believe faithfully and

firmly, he cannot be saved.

In the Lord's Supper we receive Christ's body and blood in and with the bread and wine. The two great blessings of the Lord's Supper are the forgiveness of sins and strength to live an improved Christian life. In response to the Lord's command we are to examine ourselves privately prior to partaking of the Sacrament. There are three basic questions on which we should examine ourselves, all of which we should be able to answer in the affirmative if we are to partake of the Sacrament worthily: 1) Am I truly sorry for my sins? 2) Do I believe Jesus Christ is my Savior? 3) Do I promise with God's help to live a Christian life? If you agree with the above statement, we invite you to the Sacrament.


