OLD TESTAMENT READING

Exodus 17:1–7

(God provides water from the rock at Rephidim.)

¹ The whole Israelite community set out from the Desert of Sin, traveling from place to place as the LORD commanded. They camped at Rephidim, but there was no water for the people to drink. ² So they quarreled with Moses and said, "Give us water to drink."

HOLY GOSPEL

John 4:5-26

(Jesus meets the Samaritan woman at the well.)

⁵ So he came to a town in Samaria called Sychar, near the plot of ground Jacob had given to his son Joseph. ⁶ Jacob's well was there, and Jesus, tired as he was from the journey, sat down by the well. It was about the sixth hour.

⁷ When a Samaritan woman came to draw water, Jesus said to her, "Will you give me a drink?" ⁸ (His disciples had gone into the town to buy food.)

⁹ The Samaritan woman said to him, "You are a Jew and I am a Samaritan woman. How can you ask me for a drink?" (For Jews do not associate with Samaritans.)

¹⁰ Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God and who it is that asks you for a drink, you would have asked him and he would have given you living water."

¹¹ "Sir," the woman said, "you have nothing to draw with and the well is deep. Where can you get this living water? ¹² Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us the well and drank from it himself, as did also his sons and his flocks and herds?"

¹³ Jesus answered, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, ¹⁴ but whoever drinks the water I give him will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life."

¹⁵ The woman said to him, "Sir, give me this water so that I won't get thirsty and have to keep coming here to draw water."

¹⁶ He told her, "Go, call your husband and come back."

¹⁷ "I have no husband," she replied.

Jesus said to her, "You are right when you say you have no husband. ¹⁸ The fact is, you have had five husbands, and the man you now have is not your husband. What you have just said is quite true."

¹⁹ "Sir," the woman said, "I can see that you are a prophet. ²⁰ Our fathers worshiped on this mountain, but you Jews claim that the place where we must worship is in Jerusalem."

²¹ Jesus declared, "Believe me, woman, a time is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. ²² You Samaritans worship what you do not know; we worship what we do know, for salvation is from the Jews. ²³ Yet a time is coming and has now come when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for they are the kind of worshipers the Father seeks. ²⁴ God is spirit, and his worshipers must worship in spirit and in truth."

²⁵ The woman said, "I know that Messiah" (called Christ) "is coming. When he comes, he will explain everything to us."

²⁶ Then Jesus declared, "I who speak to you am he."


▼ SACRAMENT **▼**

In the Lord's Supper we receive Christ's body and blood in and with the bread and wine. The two great blessings of the Lord's Supper are the forgiveness of sins and strength to live an improved Christian life. In response to the Lord's command we are to examine ourselves privately prior to partaking of the Sacrament. There are three basic questions on which we should examine ourselves, all of which we should be able to answer in the affirmative if we are to partake of the Sacrament worthily: 1) Am I truly sorry for my sins? 2) Do I believe Jesus Christ is my Savior? 3) Do I promise with God's help to live a Christian life? If you agree with the above statement, we invite you to the Sacrament.

WORDS OF INSTITUTION



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The Drawings

The five very large (4x6 ft) Charcoal drawings you see before you in the sanctuary were first conceived and made back in 1988 as partial fulfillment of the exhibition of my master's thesis for my MFA degree from SIUE. This exhibition was part of my very unorthodox concept of creating artwork for the Good Friday and Easter worship services for my then home church of Immanuel Lutheran Chapel.

The five charcoal drawings were made to fit between the windows along the east wall of the chapel's sanctuary for the purpose of guiding the worshipers' thoughts toward a meditation on our Lords suffering toward His journey to the cross. This image was actualized on a (9x10 ft) oil painting on canvas placed behind the altar with an altar parament of Jesus body in the tomb, surmounted by an iron and brass candle holder on the altar; all to be in place for that years Tenebrae service. I believe, not only for myself and invited family and friends, that this service had particular significance for us all.

I gifted these pieces, along with a painting of the Resurrection and accompanying paraments to Immanuel and they were brought out each Lenten season. Sadly, now that Immanuel has been closed these five drawings have followed me to Chapel of the Cross. Their themes do not coincide with the traditional 14 stations of the cross used by the Catholic Church. I conceived of them differently to be guideposts through the season of Lent and Holy Week as poignant reminders of our Lord's struggle in heart, mind, and body. These themes were Betrayal in the Garden by Judas, The Denial of Peter, the Scourging by Pilates soldiers, The Judgment by Pilate between Jesus and Barabbas, and Jesus Fall under His Cross on the way to Golgotha.

I had to choose, because of space constraints which images I felt were most significant. And now because of the realities of displaying them at Chapel of the Cross, I may need to create something to even this imbalance for their possible future home.

It is my hope that they will once again serve the worshipers heart and mind as we retrace our Lord's journey of suffering and sacrifice for our sakes this Lenten season. Soli Deo Gloria,
