

AS WE GATHER

On this Holy Trinity Sunday, we do not so much explain God as confess Him. We testify to Him who has revealed Himself to us. To the mind in search of reasonable answers, God will always be a question or riddle to be solved. But to the empty heart, the Holy Spirit leads us to see with faith the God whose majesty has worked for our salvation and whose mercy has rescued us sinners from sin and the grave. Like Nicodemus of old, we want to know how, yet our Lord gives us not the how, but the who; not the explanation, but the mystery of mercy big enough to save us.

OLD TESTAMENT READING

Isaiah 6:1–8

(We have seen the Lord of hosts.)

- ¹ In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord seated on a throne, high and exalted, and the train of his robe filled the temple. ² Above him were seraphs, each with six wings: With two wings they covered their faces, with two they covered their feet, and with two they were flying. ³ And they were calling to one another: "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD Almighty; the whole earth is full of his glory."
- ⁴ At the sound of their voices the doorposts and thresholds shook and the temple was filled with smoke.
- ⁵ "Woe to me!" I cried. "I am ruined! For I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have seen the King, the LORD Almighty."
- ⁶ Then one of the seraphs flew to me with a live coal in his hand, which he had taken with tongs from the altar. ⁷ With it he touched my mouth and said, "See, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away and your sin atoned for."

EPISTLE Acts 2:14a, 22–36

(Let all know that God has made Jesus both Lord and Christ.)

¹⁴ Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice and addressed the crowd:

²² "Men of Israel, listen to this: Jesus of Nazareth was a man accredited by God to you by miracles, wonders and signs, which God did among you through him, as you yourselves know. ²³ This man was handed over to you by God's set purpose and foreknowledge; and you, with the help of wicked men, put him to death by nailing him to the cross. ²⁴ But God raised him from the dead, freeing him from the agony of death, because it was impossible for death to keep its hold on him. ²⁵ David said about him:

" 'I saw the Lord always before me. Because he is at my right hand, I will not be shaken.

²⁹ "Brothers, I can tell you confidently that the patriarch David died and was buried, and his tomb is here to this day. ³⁰ But he was a prophet and knew that God had promised him on oath that he would place one of his descendants on his throne. ³¹ Seeing what was ahead, he spoke of the resurrection of the Christ, that he was not abandoned to the grave, nor did his body see decay. ³² God has raised this Jesus to life, and we are all witnesses of the fact. ³³ Exalted to the right hand of God, he has received from the Father the promised Holy Spirit and has poured out what you now see and hear. ³⁴ For David did not ascend to heaven, and yet he said,

Pastor: The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the third chapter.

People: Glory to You, O Lord.

HOLY GOSPEL John 3:1–17

("For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son.")

- ¹ Now there was a man of the Pharisees named Nicodemus, a member of the Jewish ruling council. ² He came to Jesus at night and said, "Rabbi, we know you are a teacher who has come from God. For no one could perform the miraculous signs you are doing if God were not with him."
- ³ In reply Jesus declared, "I tell you the truth, no one can see the kingdom of God unless he is born again."
- ⁴ "How can a man be born when he is old?"Nicodemus asked. "Surely he cannot enter a second time into his mother's womb to be born!"
- ⁵ Jesus answered, "I tell you the truth, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless he is born of water and the Spirit. ⁶ Flesh gives birth to flesh, but the Spirit gives birth to spirit. ⁷ You should not be surprised at my saying, 'You must be born again.' ⁸ The wind blows wherever it pleases. You hear its sound, but you cannot tell where it comes from or where it is going. So it is with everyone born of the Spirit."
- 9 "How can this be?" Nicodemus asked.
- ¹⁰ "You are Israel's teacher," said Jesus, "and do you not understand these things? ¹¹ I tell you the truth, we speak of what we know, and we testify to what we have seen, but still you people do not accept our testimony. ¹² I have spoken to you of earthly things and you do not believe; how then will you believe if I speak of heavenly things? ¹³ No one has ever gone into heaven except the one who came from heaven—the Son of Man. ¹⁴ Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the desert, so the Son of Man must be lifted up, ¹⁵ that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life.

¹⁶ "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. ¹⁷ For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him.

Pastor: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

People: Praise to You, O Christ.

ATHANASIAN CREED

Pastor: We confess the Triune God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit as we profess

portions of the ancient ecumenical creed written in the third century, on the basis of church father, Athanasius' teachings. Whoever will be saved shall, above all else, hold the catholic* faith ... (*universal)

People: And the catholic faith is this, that we worship one God in three persons

and three persons in one God, neither confusing the persons nor

dividing the substance.

Men: The Father is uncreated, incomprehensible, eternal.
Women: The Son is uncreated, incomprehensible, eternal.
People: The Spirit is uncreated, incomprehensible, eternal.

Pastor: So likewise the Father is almighty God, the Son is almighty God, and the

Holy Spirit is almighty God.

People: And yet they are not three Lords but one Lord.

Pastor: For we are compelled by the Christian truth to acknowledge every person

by Himself to be both God and Lord,

Men: So we cannot by the catholic faith say that there are three Gods or three

Lords ...

Women: There is one Father, not three Fathers; one Son, not three Sons; one

Holy Spirit, not three Holy Spirits.

Pastor: And in this Trinity none is before or after another; none is greater or less

than another; \dots so that in all things \dots the Unity in Trinity is to be

worshiped.

People: He, therefore, that will be saved is compelled thus to think of the

Trinity.

Pastor: Furthermore, it is necessary to everlasting salvation that he also believe

faithfully the incarnation of our Lord Jesus Christ. For the right faith is that we believe and confess that our Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is

God and man.

Men: Who suffered for our salvation, descended into hell, rose again the

third day from the dead.

Women: He ascended into heaven, He sits at the right hand of the Father, God

Almighty, from whence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

Men: At whose coming all men will rise again with their bodies and will give

an account of their own works.

Women: And they that have done good will go into life everlasting; and they

that have done evil, into everlasting fire.

Pastor: This is the catholic faith which, except a person believe faithfully and

firmly, he cannot be saved.

In the Lord's Supper we receive Christ's body and blood in and with the bread and wine. There are three basic questions on which we should examine ourselves, all of which we should be able to answer in the affirmative if we are to partake of the Sacrament worthily: 1) Am I truly sorry for my sins?

2) Do I believe Jesus Christ is my Savior? 3) Do I promise with God's help to live a Christian life? If you agree with the above statement, we invite you to the Sacrament.

Pastor: Lift up your hearts


People: We lift them to the Lord.
