AS WE GATHER

OLD TESTAMENT READING

Ezekiel 18:1-4, 25-32

(The prophet gives words of warning.)

¹ The word of the LORD came to me: ² "What do you people mean by quoting this proverb about the land of Israel:

" 'The fathers eat sour grapes, and the children's teeth are set on edge'?


