## "In Every Thing Give Thanks...."

The Bible says, "In every thing give thanks...." (I Thessalonians 5:18). In this thanksgiving season, it is especially important to carry out this clear Bible command! I would like to make a simple list of four things in life I am thankful for and a brief statement as to why....

## 1. I am thankful for the loving gift of relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ!

"Thanks be unto God for his unspeakable gift" (II Corinthians 9:15). Without Christ we all would be doomed and damned forever!
