Thoughts on the Catastrophe Avoided

1. God is good.

Only the Lord knows the many different catastrophes that may have been averted by God's providence that only Heaven will reveal. Even in the midst of catastrophes that have come, we find that God gives His people strength to carry on. "Many, O LORD my God, are thy wonderful works which thou hast done, and thy thoughts which are to us-ward: they cannot be reckoned up in order unto thee: if I would declare and speak of them, they are more than can be numbered" (Psalm 40:5).

2. Let us repent.

"If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land" II Chronicles 7:14).
