“OUR JUSTIFICATION BY GOD’S GRACE ALONE THROUGH FAITH ALONE IN CHRIST ALONE” ROMANS 3:21-26 CAMERON BARHAM

Key Truth: God displays His righteousness in our justification by His grace alone through faith alone in Christ alone.

Introduction:

Q: *Are we being saved to or from God? How does this affect which way you run when you sin or are sinned against?*

Romans 3:21-26: God's Righteousness Displayed in Our Justification:

“The wonder of the cross is that in the very same stroke it satisfies both the love of God and the justice of God. At the very same time it shows us that God is *both* the Judge, who cares enough about his world to set standards and hold us accountable to them; *and* the Justifier, who has done everything necessary to forgive and restore us. He is a Father worth having, and he is a Father we can have. The cross is where, gloriously and liberatingly, we see that he is “just and the one who justifies those who have faith in Jesus” (**Romans 3:26**).”
