"THE ROLE OF OUR JUSTIFICATION IN SANCTIFICATION AND GLORIFICATION" ROMANS 6:20-23 CAMERON BARHAM

Key Truth: The fruit of our justification helps us to grow in sanctification and prepares us for glorification in Jesus.

Introduction:

Q: *What most influences how you see yourself?*

Romans 6:20-23: The Fruit of Justification and Its Role in Sanctification and Glorification:

"...we should constantly be reminding ourselves who we are. We need to learn to talk to ourselves, and ask ourselves questions: "Don't you know? Don't you know the meaning of your conversion and baptism? Don't you know that you have been united to Christ in his death and resurrection? Don't you know that you have been enslaved to God and have committed yourself to his obedience? Don't you know these things? Don't you know who you are?" We must go on pressing ourselves with such questions, until we reply to ourselves: 'Yes, I *do* know who I am, a new person in Christ, and by the grace of God I shall live accordingly.'"
