UPDATE ON THE STOCKS

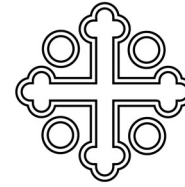

"A PRAYER FOR THE DISORIENTED"

PSALM 90

CAMERON BARHAM

Key Truth: Our disorientation should lead us to orient by God's character, honestly express our disorientation to Him, and reorient in obedience according to His promises.

Introduction:

Q: *When you feel disoriented, what helps to reorient you?*

Psalm 90:1-2: Divine Orientation: A Hymn of Praise to God, Our Eternal Heavenly Father:

"This opening of the psalm corresponds to the close, in that God is seen here as our God, whose eternity is the answer, not simply the antithesis, to our homelessness and brevity of life."

Derek Kidner, *Psalms 73-150*

Q: *What impact does it have on you to know that God is eternal, unchanging, and good?*

Psalm 90:3-11: Human Disorientation: A Lament for Sin and Death:

Q: *How does knowing that your life is brief and that you are powerless against death affect how you live?*

Psalm 90:12-17: Divine Reorientation: A Prayer for Wisdom and Mercy:

"We come and go, but the Lord's work abides. We are content to die, so long as Jesus lives and his kingdom grows. Since the Lord abides forever the same, we trust our work in his hands and feel that since it is far more his work than ours he will secure it in immortality. When we have withered like grass, our holy services, like gold, silver, and precious stones, will survive the fire."

Application:
