
NEW WOMEN'S BIBLE STUDY

"THE COST OF FOOLISH PRIDE" ESTHER 3:1-15 CAMERON BARHAM

Key Truth: God calls us to live in wise humility for the edification and benefit of ourselves and others.

Introduction:

Q: How has your foolish pride proved costly to you and those you love?

Esther 3:1-15: The Deadly Folly of a Fool's Hatred:

"Identification with God's people can result in hardship. Hatred and bitterness were at the root of Haman's quest for power. For him power rested in the complete destruction of the Jews. Haman had not yet encountered the power of their God."

Q: In what areas of your life are you struggling under the burden of foolish pride and hatred of others? Where should you wisely run to receive wise counsel and help to become more Christ-like?

Application:

Esther 3:1-15 teaches us that:

+ Issurance OF PARDON

⁶ Now when Jesus was at Bethany in the house of Simon the leper, ⁷ a woman came up to him with an alabaster flask of very expensive ointment, and she poured it on his head as he reclined at table. ⁸ And when the disciples saw it, they were indignant, saying, "Why this waste? ⁹ For this could have been sold for a large sum and given to the poor." ¹⁰ But Jesus, aware of this, said to them, "Why do you trouble the woman? For she has done a beautiful thing to me. ¹¹ For you always have the poor with you, but you will not always have me. ¹² In pouring this ointment on my body, she has done it to prepare me for burial. ¹³ Truly, I say to you, wherever this gospel is proclaimed in the whole world, what she has done will also be told in memory of her."
