Introduction:

Q: What do you regularly celebrate? Why?

Esther 9:20-10:3: From Sorrow to Gladness, From Mourning into a Holiday:

"Good news must be celebrated, and Christians might ponder whether or not we have at times made the good news of Christ seem rather less appealing than it is by losing a sense of celebration. After all, how can anyone know that the deliverance celebrated is good news if it is hidden behind a façade so serious that no one can see how life changing it is?"

44 Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms must be fulfilled." 45 Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures, 46 and said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Christ should suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, 47 and that repentance for[a] the forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. 48 You are witnesses of these things. 49 And behold, I am sending the promise of my Father upon you.
