We will not have childcare on Easter so our volunteers will have the opportunity to attend worship with their families. Join us at 10:30 for our worship service as we celebrate Easter.


CHURCH PICNIC, APRIL 14

"THE FOOL'S LAST SUPPER" ESTHER 6:12-7:6 CAMERON BARHAM

Key Truth: <u>God calls us to wise repentance and the fruits of forgiveness in Christ so that we know that we are eternally welcome at His heavenly feast.</u>

Introduction:

Q: Have you ever attended an uncomfortable meal where the goal was confrontation? How did it affect your experience of the meal?

Esther 6:12-7:6: An Uncomfortable Truth and a Bitter Feast for a Falling Fool:

"Haman is soon apprehensive of his danger: *He was afraid before the king and queen*; and it was time for him to fear when the queen was his prosecutor, the king his judge, and his own conscience a witness against him; and the surprising operation of Providence against him that same morning could not but increase his fear. Now he has little joy of his being invited to the banquet of wine, but finds himself in straits when he thought himself in the fullness of his sufficiency. He is cast into a net by his own feet." Matthew Henry, *Commentary on the Whole Bible: Vol. II—Joshua to Esther*

Q: What keeps you from feeling welcome at your Abba Father's heavenly feast? What helps you to wisely repent and enjoy the fruits of forgiveness?

Application:

Esther 6:12-7:6 teaches us that:

Communion

Benediction: 1 Corinthians 15:53-58



Gracious and Merciful Father,

We come before you to confess our sin as Your redeemed and beloved children. May Your Spirit alone convict us of our sin and remind us of our pardon in Christ through repentance.

(*Take a moment to silently confess.*)

We confess that our arrogance leads us further from You in anxious fear of judgment and death (Esther 6:12-7:6).

We confess these things before You because You are faithful to forgive us in Christ.

¹When Jesus had spoken these words, he went out with his disciples across the brook Kidron, where there was a garden, which he and his disciples entered. ² Now Judas, who betrayed him, also knew the place, for Jesus often met there with his disciples. ³ So Judas, having procured a band of soldiers and some officers from the chief priests and the Pharisees, went there with lanterns and torches and weapons.⁴ Then Jesus, knowing all that would happen to him, came forward and said to them, "Whom do you seek?" ⁵ They answered him, "Jesus of Nazareth." Jesus said to them, "I am he." Judas, who betrayed him, was standing with them. 6 When Jesus said to them, "I am he," they drew back and fell to the ground. ⁷ So he asked them again, "Whom do you seek?" And they said, "Jesus of Nazareth." 8 Jesus answered, "I told you that I am he. Go to Dark Gethsemane

Go to dark Gethsemane, You who feel the tempter's pow'r; Your Redeemer's conflict see; Watch with Him one bitter hour; Turn not from His griefs away; Learn of Jesus Christ to pray.

Follow to the judgment hall; View the Lord of life arraigned; O the worm-wood and the gall! O the pangs His soul sustained! Shun not suff'ring, shame, or loss; Learn of Him to bear the cross.
