Romans 1:1-7:Paul's Greeting to the Roman Church: Salvation in Christ Alone:

"The divine origin of the gospel is asserted in calling it *the gospel of God*. It is the glad annunciation which God makes to (humanity) of the pardon of sin, of restoration to his favor, of the renovation of their nature, of the resurrection of the body, and of eternal life."

Romans 11:11-12; 15:5-7: Paul's Goal for the Roman Church: Unity in Christ Alone:

It is important to see how much the book of Romans is addressed to the problems of how people from very different cultural backgrounds and religious traditions can live in unity as Christians."
