"JESUS CALLS HIS DISCIPLES" MARK 1:14-20 ROBBY BAXTER

Key Truth: <u>Jesus's call to repent, believe the gospel, and follow Him identifies</u> Him as worthy of the trust and obedience that belong to God alone.

Introduction:

Q: What is the message of Jesus to the world today?

Mark 1:14-20: The Gospel of God and the Call of God:

"What it means to follow Jesus is not in the forefront of Mark's mind at this point [of the story]. Mark's focus falls only on Jesus as the One who calls, not on the disciples who leave their nets. Readers have been informed in the introduction that Jesus is the Son of God empowered by the Holy Spirit. The only explanation that readers can give for the sudden obedience of these disciples is that Jesus' call possesses a divine power that compels them to obey. In Mark's narrative, that power alone, not human calculations or circumstances, impels them to obey...Instead of asking, 'Why do the disciples leave everything to follow Jesus so abruptly?' one should ask, 'Who is this who generates such immediate obedience?'"

Application Questions:

- 1. How have you responded to Jesus's call to follow Him?
- 2. What have been and what continue to be obstacles in your own life to following Jesus?
- 3. What do these particular obstacles reveal about your ideas about your life and identity? What do they reveal about your knowledge of Jesus's identity?

Mark 1:14-20 teaches us that Jesus's call to repent, believe the gospel, and follow Him identifies Him as worthy of the trust and obedience that belong to God alone.

¹⁶ "Behold, I am sending for many fishers, declares the Lord, and they shall catch them. And afterward, I will send for many hunters, and they shall hunt them from every mountain and every hill, and out of the clefts of the rocks. ¹⁷ For my eyes are on all their ways.
