"REPENTANCE: TURNING FROM SIN AND SELF TO RELATIONSHIP WITH JESUS" LUKE 5:27-32 MATT O'SULLIVAN

Key Truth: <u>Jesus calls us to deny our desire to rely on ourselves and take up the cross</u> of following Him through repentance.

Introduction:

Q: What is the goal of repentance?

Luke 5:27-29: Repentance Is Taking up the Cross of Following Jesus

Luke 5:30-32: Repentance Is Denying Our Desire to Rely on Ourselves

"Repentance is not just the gateway into relationship with the triune God; it is the pathway for that continuing relationship ... Repentance is thus a way of life, and it is the way to experience the abundance of life the Father intended, for which the Son suffered and into which the Spirit leads.... The priority is placed on the positive return to relationship with God through the Spirit of grace, even as we grieve over our failures, confess our sins and abandon our sinful attitudes, speech or actions."

Mark J. Boda, 'Return to Me': A Biblical Theology of Repentance

Application Questions:

- 1. How is Jesus's desire to draw near to sinners shaping your practice of repentance?
- 2. In what ways are you trying to control your relationship with Jesus through your behavior?
- 3. Where are you avoiding repentance? Where are you weary in repentance? How might recovering the relational focus of repentance bring you renewal?

Luke 5:27-32 teaches us that Jesus calls us to deny our desire to rely on ourselves and take up the cross of following Him through repentance.
