"THE HUMBLE POSTURE OF THE FORGIVEN: THE DENIAL OF SELF-RIGHTEOUSNESS AND TAKING UP THE CROSS OF HUMILITY" LUKE 18:9-14 CAMERON BARHAM

Key Truth: <u>Jesus calls us to deny our self-righteous works and identities as we take up</u> the cross of humility in forgiveness to love God and others in a more Christ-like way.

Introduction:

Q: Who are you glad that you are not like?

"True righteousness is a matter of confidence in God rather than self (Isa 8:17; 2 Cor 1:9; Heb 2:13), but the gifts of grace in the life of a believer easily tempt one to an attitude of superiority rather than humility and gratitude. This parable is about that temptation."

Luke 18:9-14: The Prayer of the Self-Righteous Availeth Nothing While the Prayer of the Humble Sinner Seeking Mercy Availeth Much:

"All the Lord's people have not gifts or money. All are not called to preach, or write, or fill a prominent place in the church. But all are called to be humble. One grace at least should adorn the poorest and must unlearned believer. That grace is humility. Let us leave the whole passage with a deep sense of the great encouragement it affords to all who feel their sins, and cry to God for mercy in Christ's name. Their sins may have been many and great. Their prayers may seem weak, faltering, unconnected, and poor. But let them remember the publican, and take courage. That same Jesus who commended his prayer is sitting at the right hand of God to receive sinners. Then let them hope and pray on."
