D. What's the significance of Ruth being welcomed to Boaz's table and eating until she's satisfied?

E. In what ways does Boaz point us to the One true Redeemer? How does this encourage you?

III. The Redeemer Requested – Read Ruth 3:1-18 and answer the following questions

A. What do you think about Naomi's strategy to secure a redeemer for Ruth (vv.1-5)?

B. List all the things that Ruth was willing to risk in order to request Boaz to be her redeemer?

C. Boaz informs Ruth that there is another redeemer. How does this highlight Boaz's character?

D. How do the details of Ruth 3:1-18 show us the way in which we should approach our Redeemer?
