Purposeful Endurance

Proclamation Life Groups; 2 Timothy 2:1-13; Week of Sunday, July 31, 2016; Steve Thiel

Suffering is unavoidable when we faithfully preach, teach, and guard the good news of the gospel; and therefore, endurance is absolutely essential if souls are going to be saved and we're going to receive the prize of eternal glory.

I. Strengthened by the Gospel – Read 2 Timothy 2:1

- A. What do you think it means to "be strengthened by the grace that is in Christ Jesus"?
- B. How does Ephesians 6:10-20 help us remember that our strength is not in ourselves?
- C. Which sources provide you with the most encouragement: prayer, bible reading, listening to sermons or worship music, verse memorization, or meeting with other Christians?

II. Strategy to Guard the Gospel – Read 2 Timothy 2:2

- A. In verse 2, how many generations of faithful men are listed?
- B. When Paul says, "faithful men who are able to teach", who comes to your mind?
- C. How does the strategy given in 2 Timothy 2:2 guard the gospel? Why not a statement of faith?
- D. Are you being discipled by someone in your church? Why or why not? Are you personally discipling someone younger or less mature in the faith? Why or why not?

III. Suffering Endured for the Gospel – Read 2 Timothy 2:3-13

- A. What three examples does Paul give us in verses 3-7? What is the point of each example?
- B. Are there any good things in your life that are keeping you from doing the main thing (Matthew 28:18-20)? What good things keep you from making disciples of all the nations?
- C. What is Paul's purpose for enduring suffering? How does election fuel Paul's evangelism?
- D. What promise is given in the first two lines of the trustworthy statement quoted (vv.11-12a)? What warning is given in the second two lines (vv.12b-13)? How do they motivate you?
